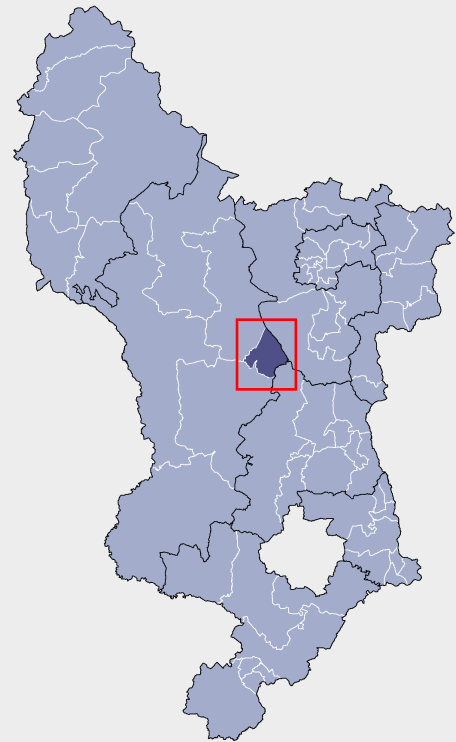
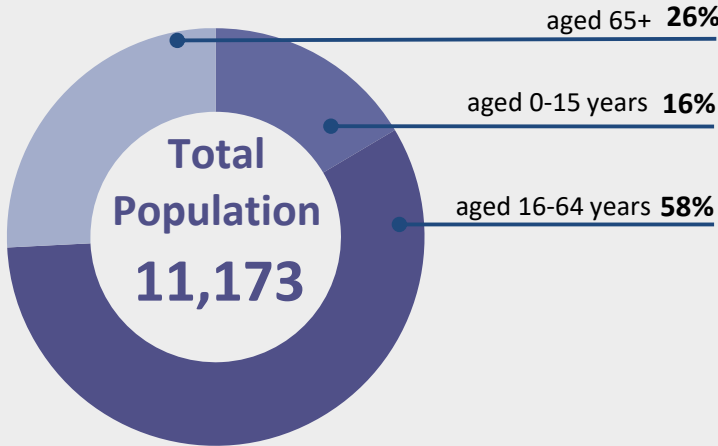


2021 Area Summary Profile Matlock Electoral Division

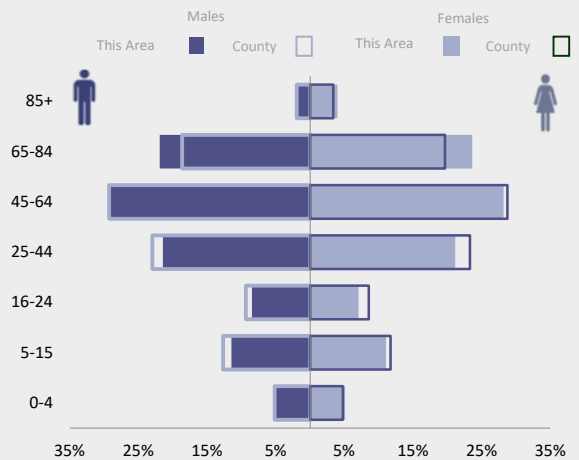

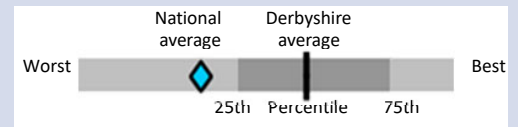
