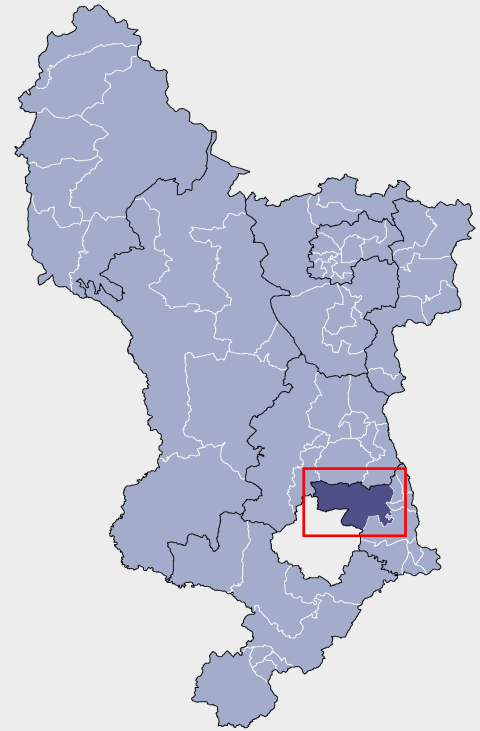
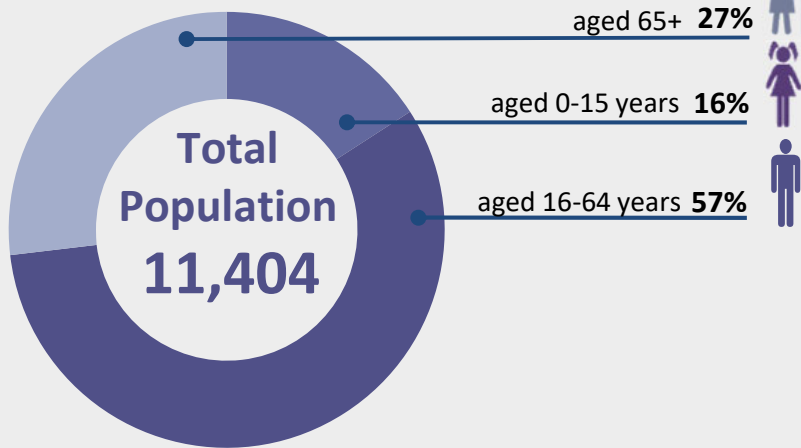

Breadsall and West Hallam Electoral Division



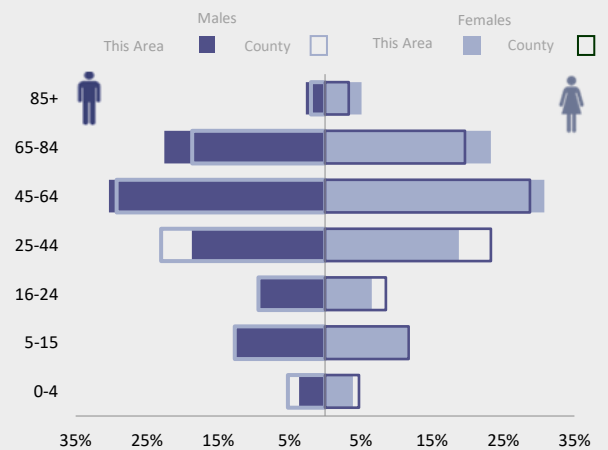

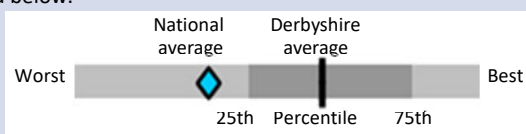
