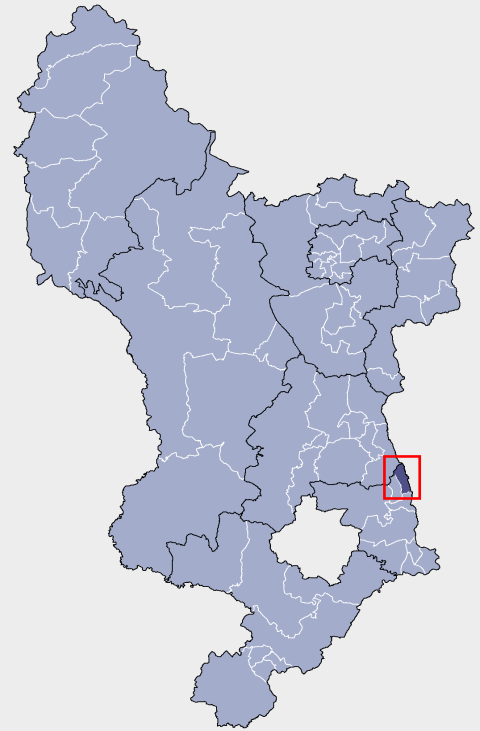
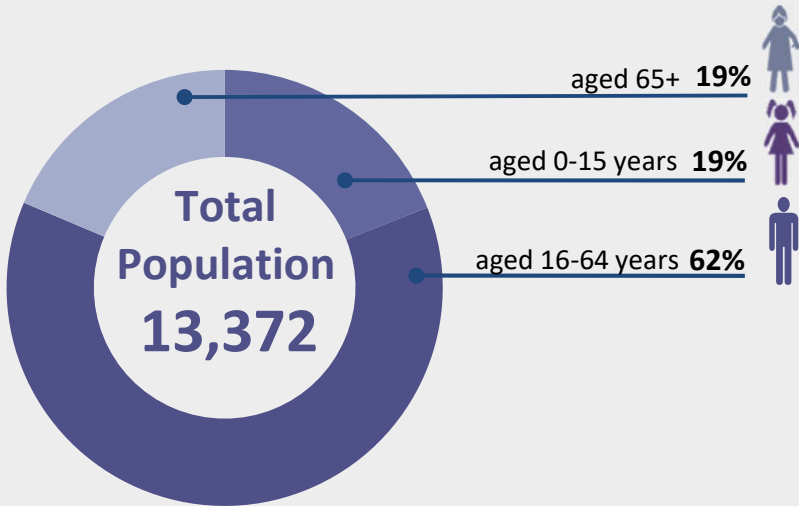


2021 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston East Electoral Division

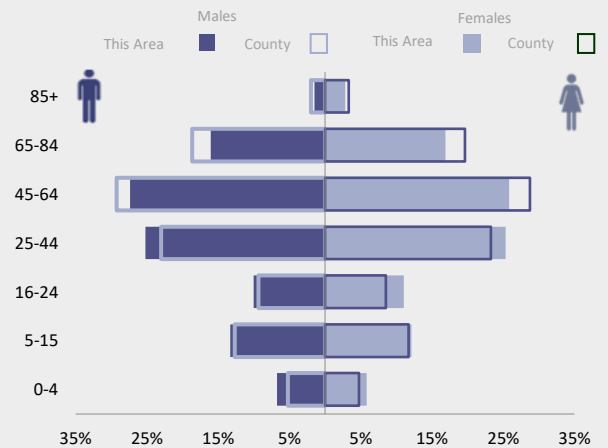

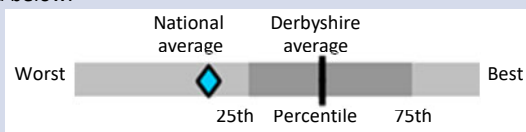
