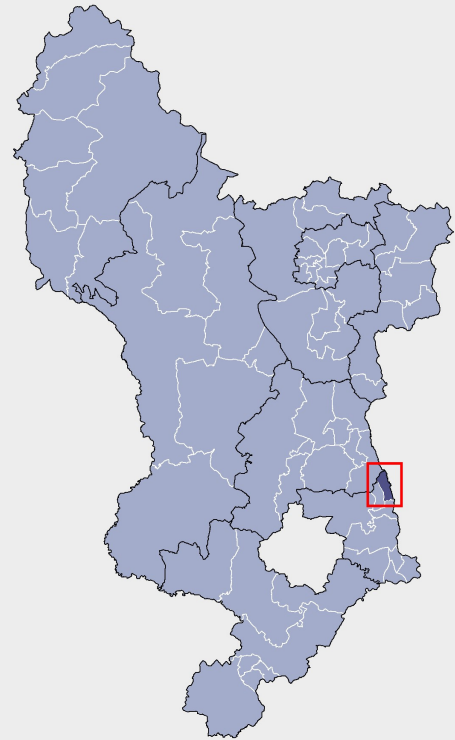
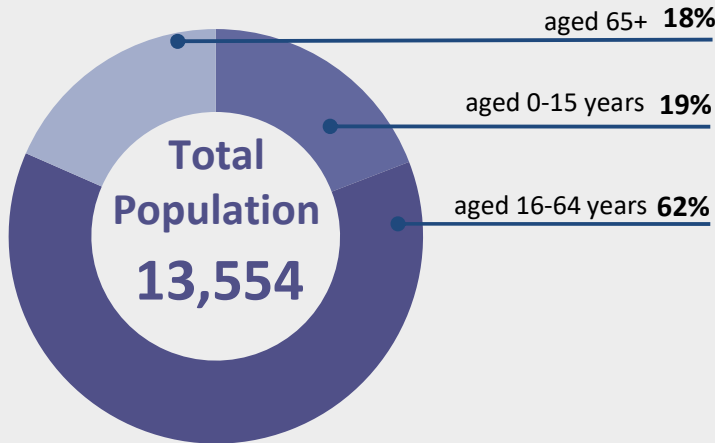


2023 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston East Electoral Division

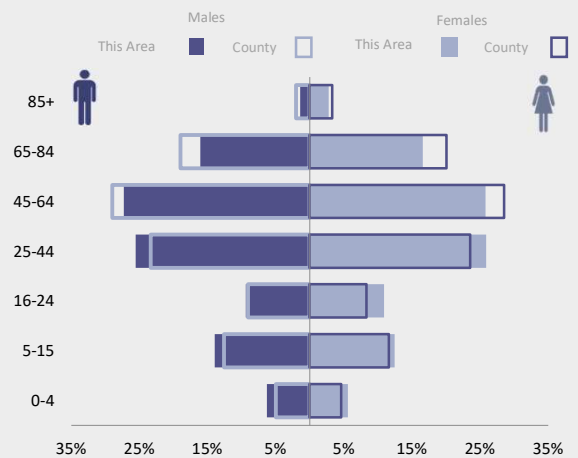

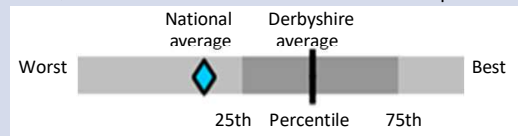
