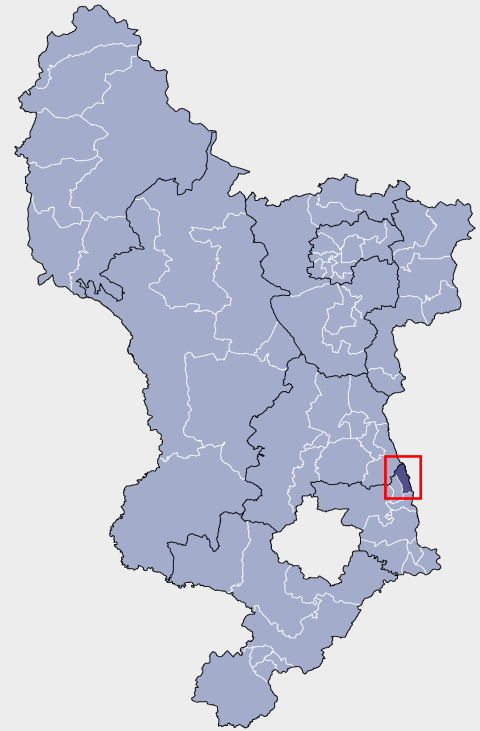
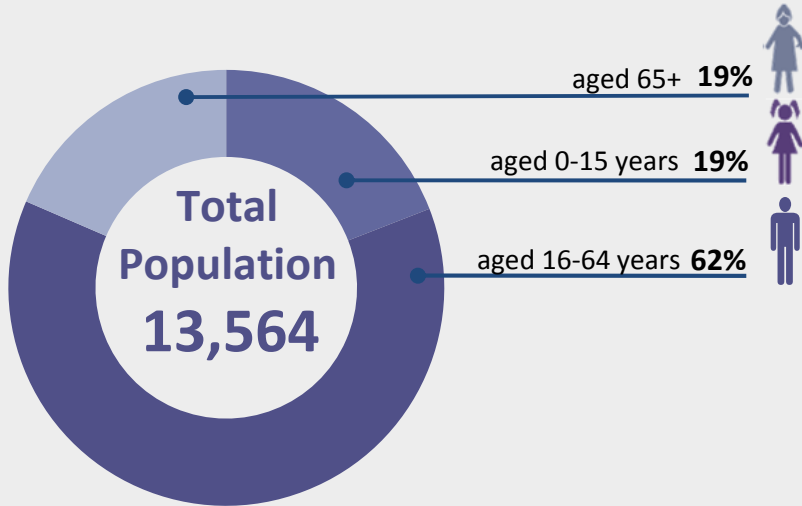


2018 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston East Electoral Division

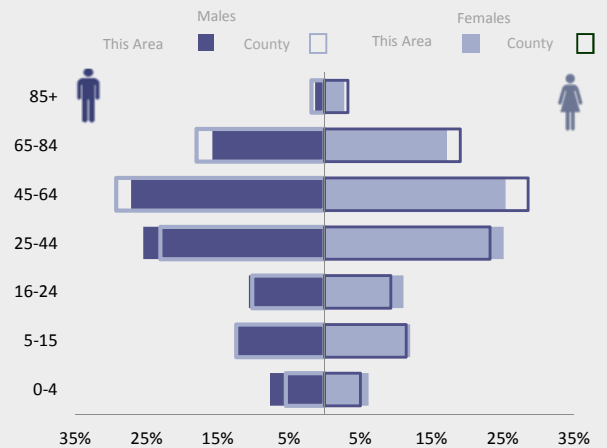

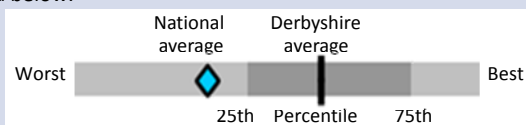
