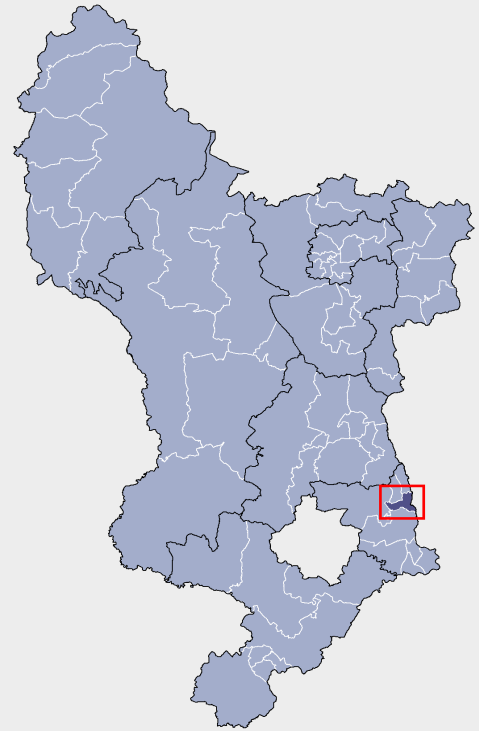
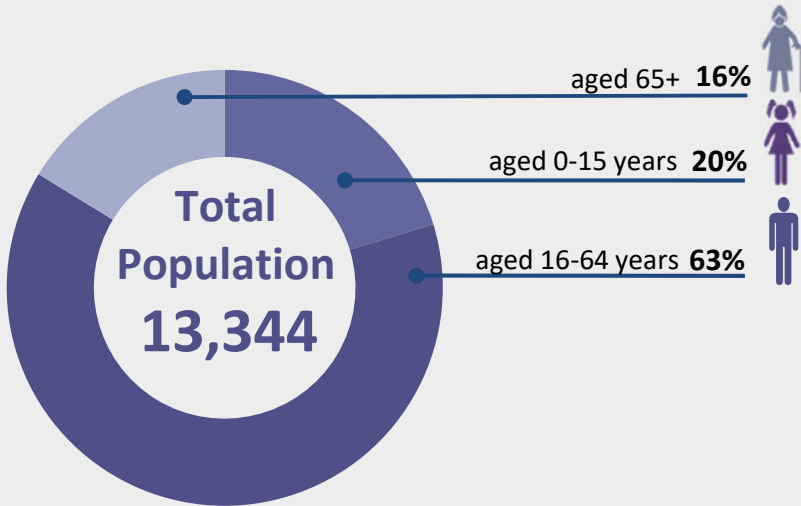


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston South Electoral Division

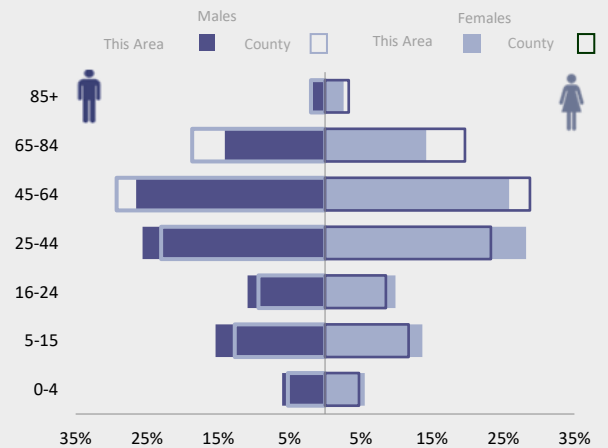


Ilkeston South division in the east of Erewash is mainly urban. The division comprises the wards of Old Park, Hallam Fields and the southern part of Kirk Hallam.

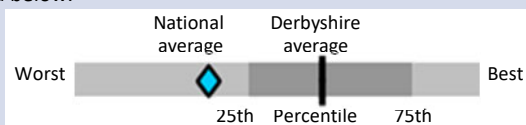
# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Ilkeston South Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
