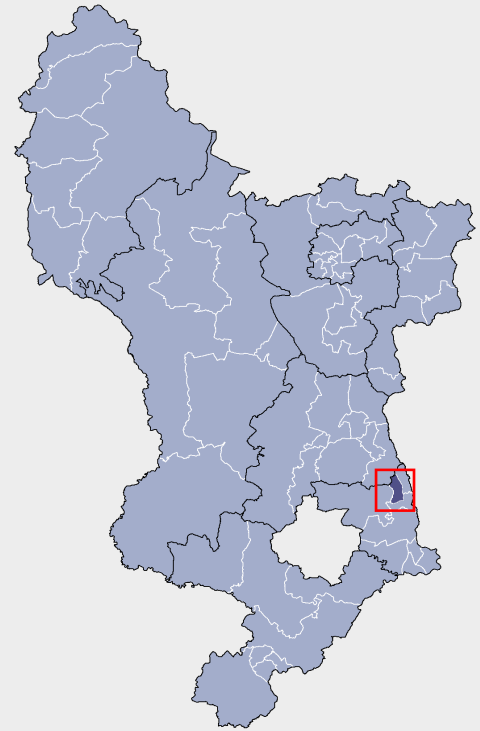
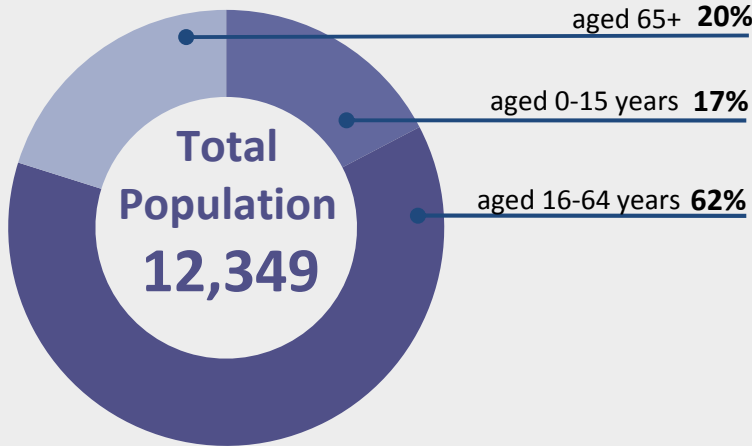


2018 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston West Electoral Division

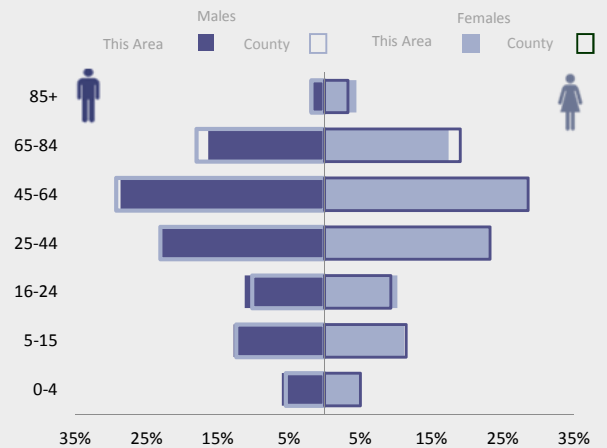

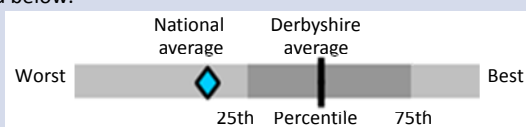

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
