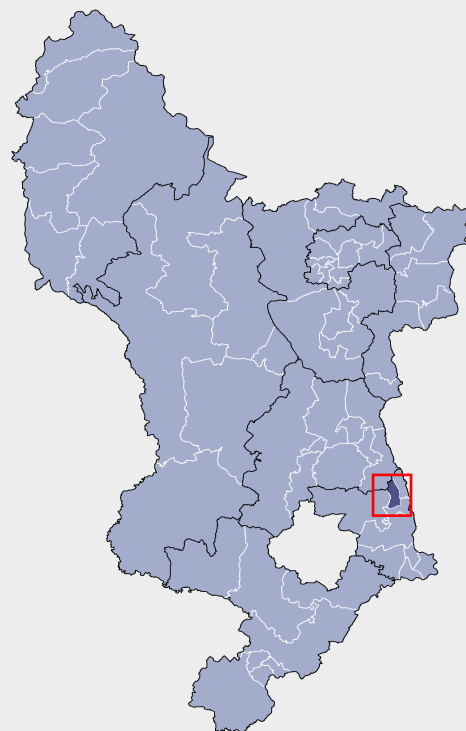
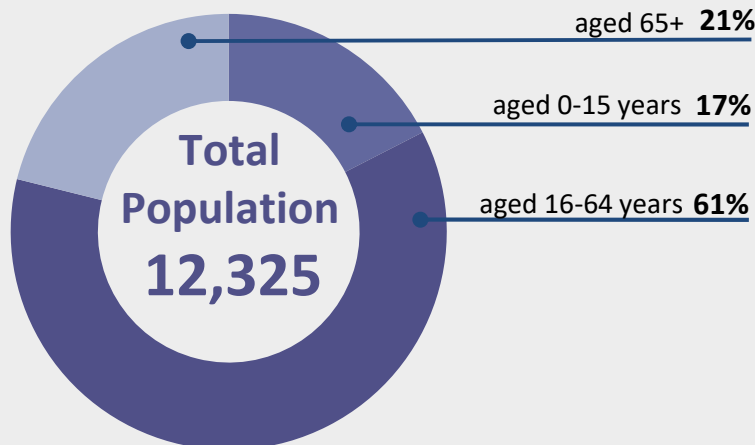


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Ilkeston West Electoral Division

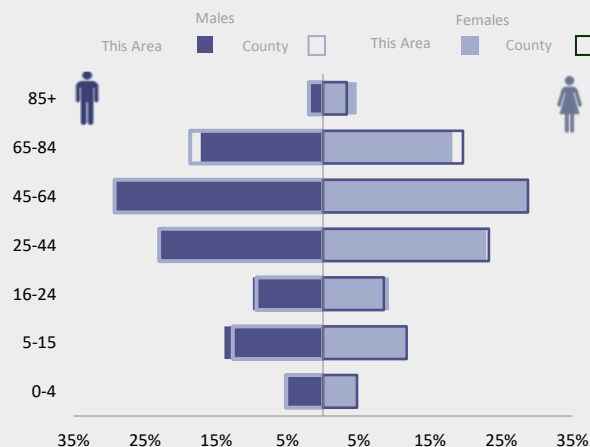

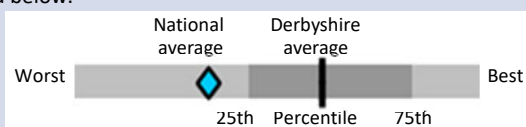
# 2021 Area Summary Profile
