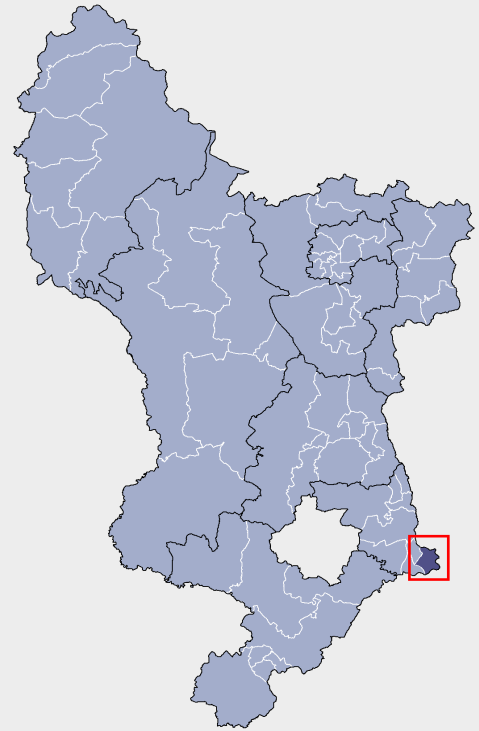
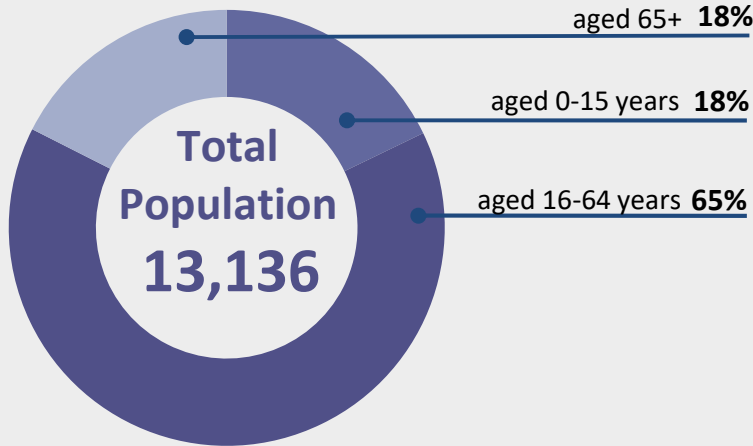


2021 Area Summary Profile Long Eaton Electoral Division

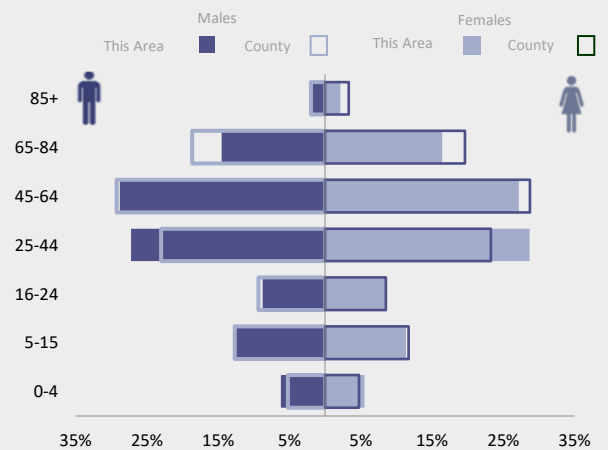

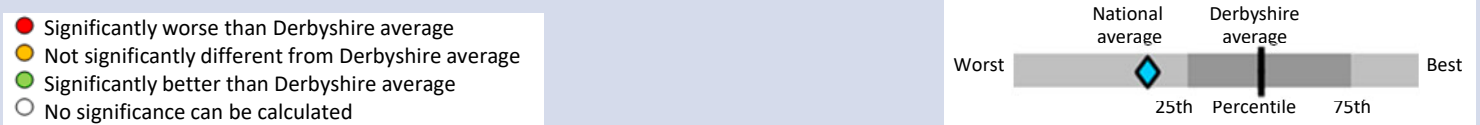
