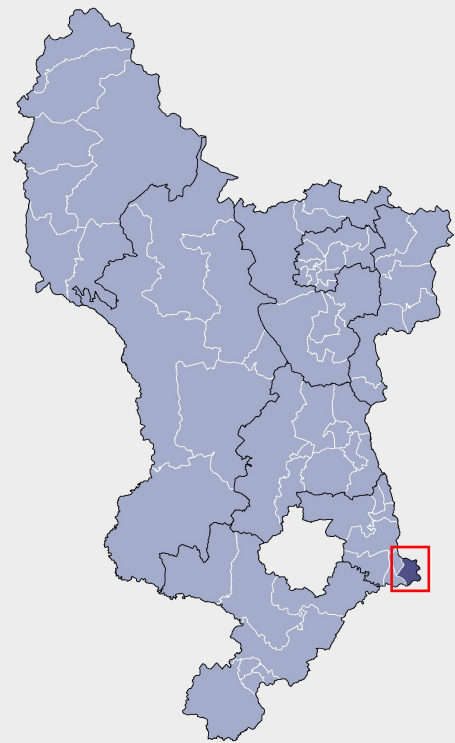
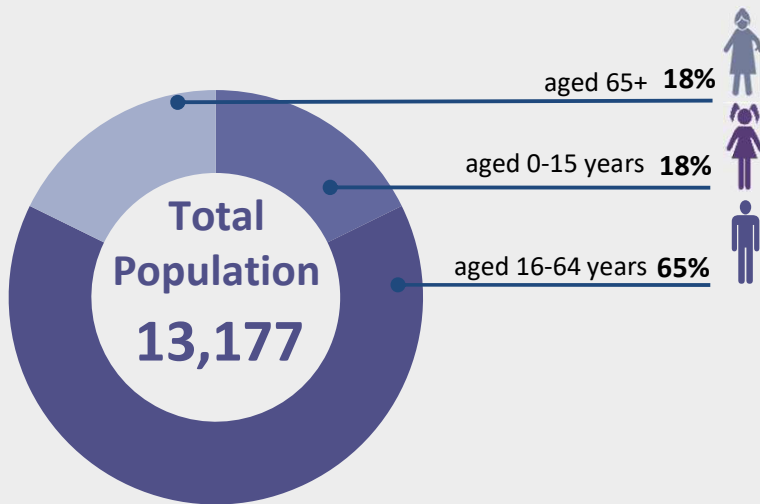


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Long Eaton Electoral Division

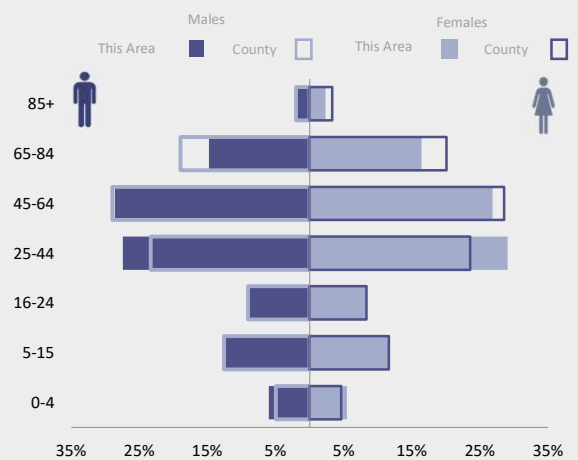

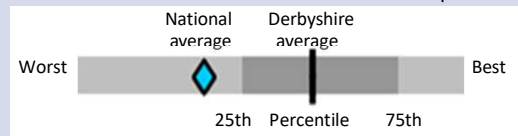
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Long Eaton Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary.
