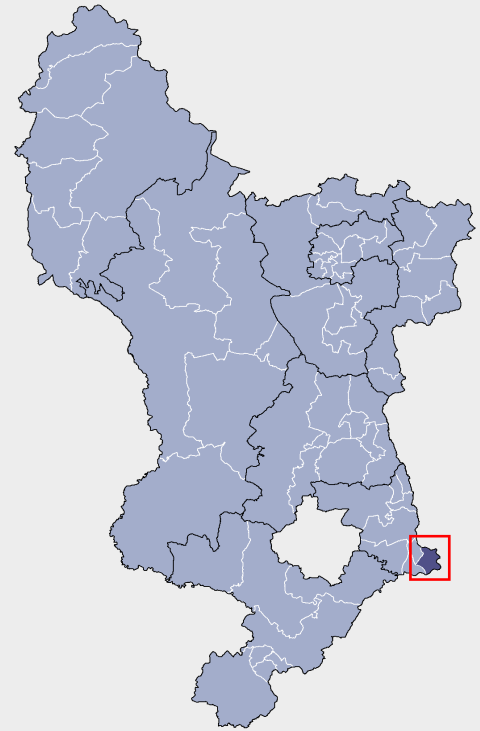
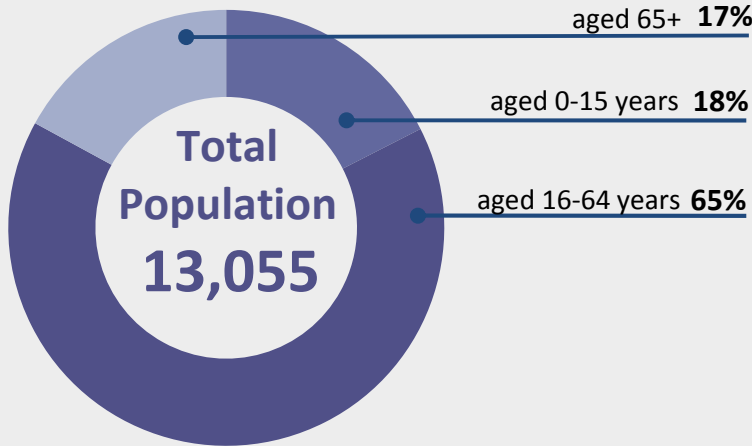


2018 Area Summary Profile Long Eaton Electoral Division

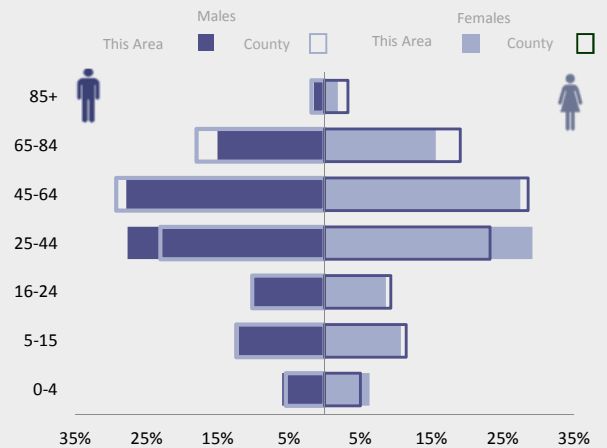

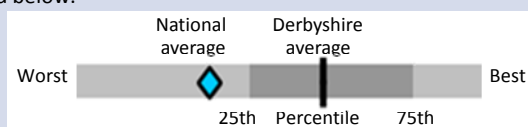

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
