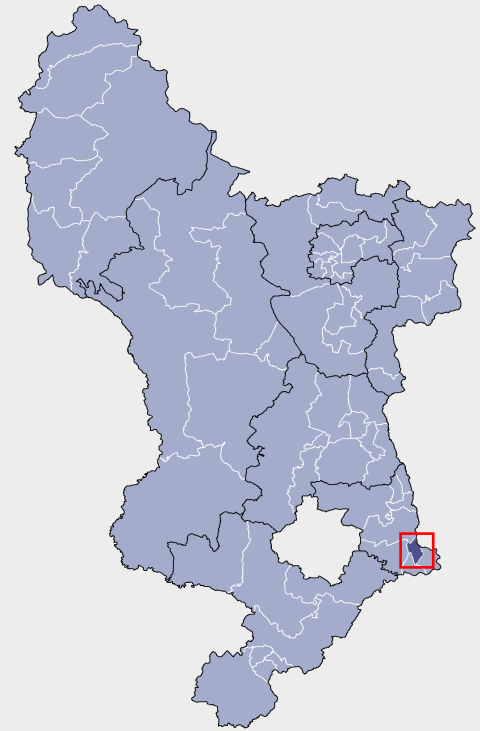
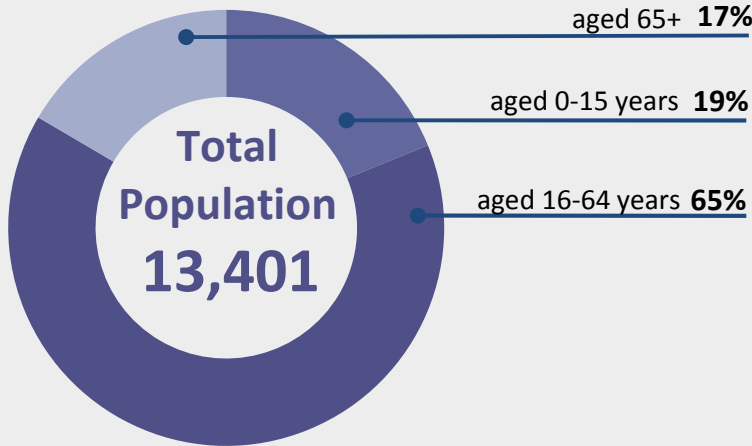


2018 Area Summary Profile Petersham Electoral Division

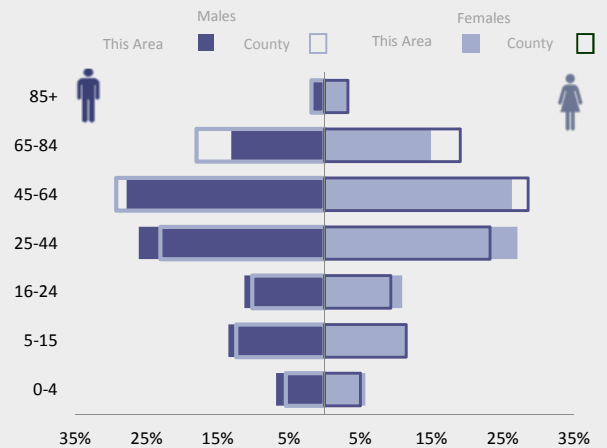

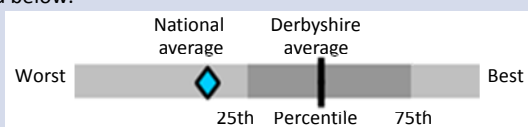
