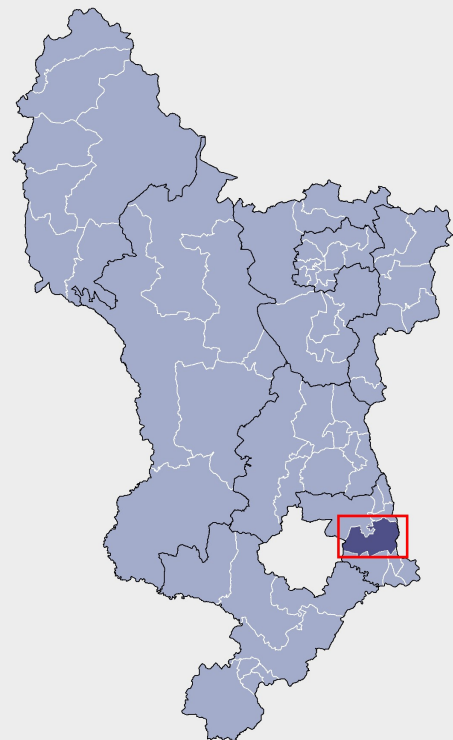
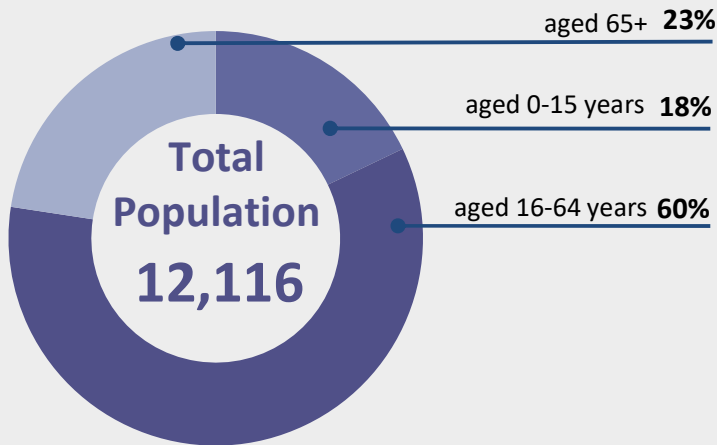


2023 Area Summary Profile Sandiacre Electoral Division

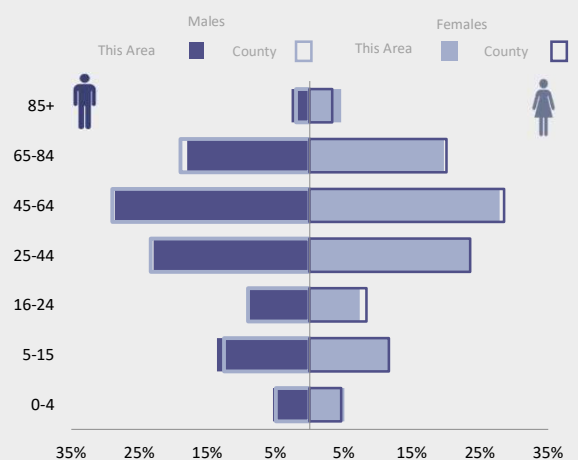

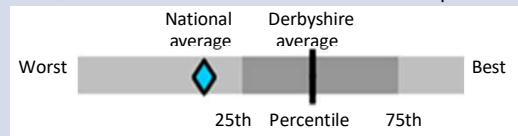
