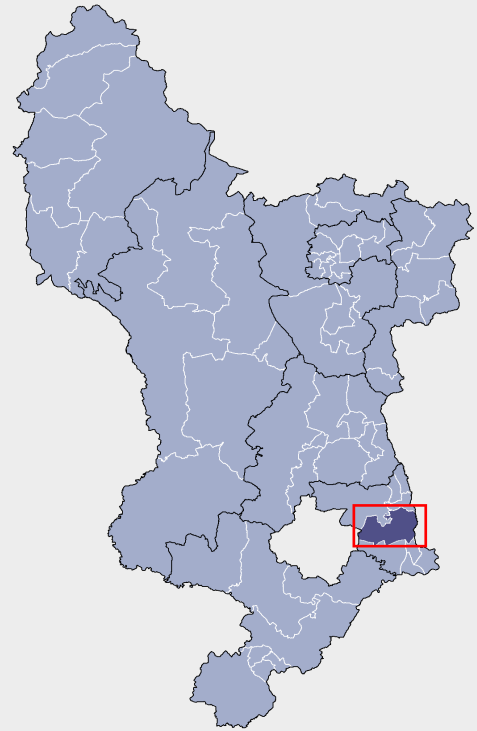
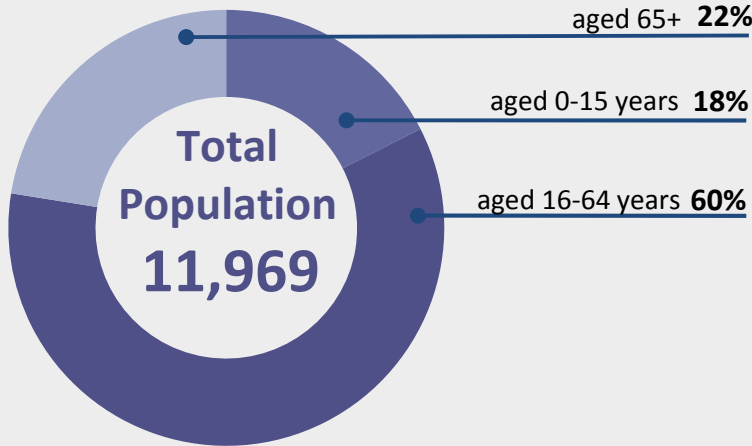


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Sandiacre Electoral Division

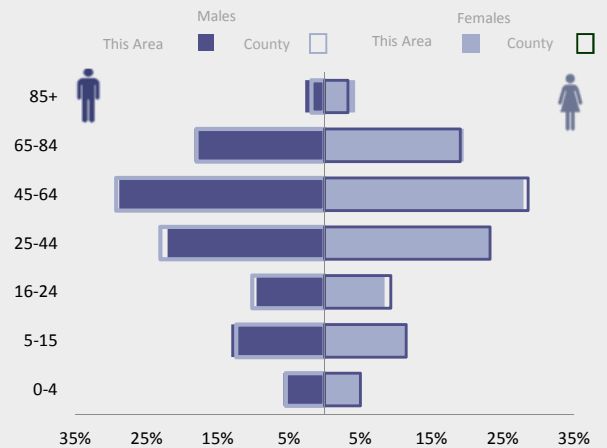

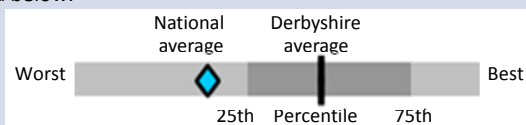
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Sandiacre Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
