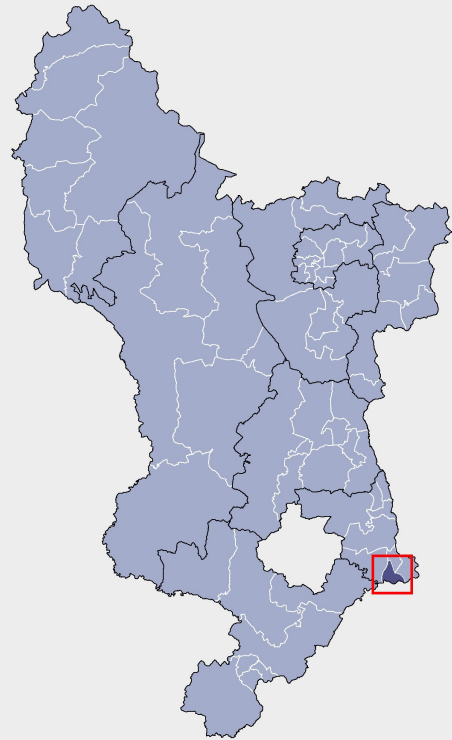
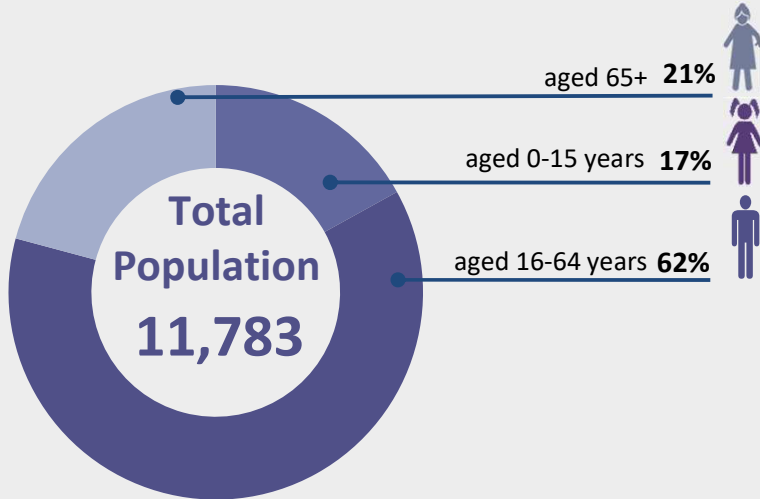


2023 Area Summary Profile Sawley Electoral Division

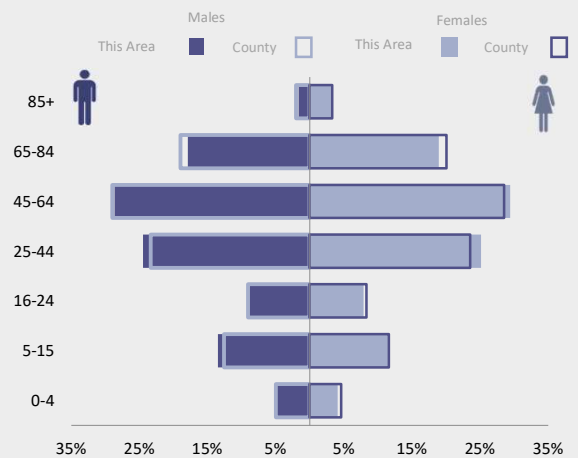

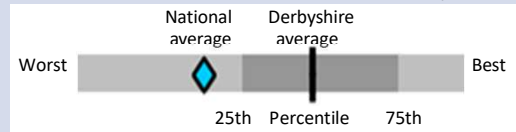
