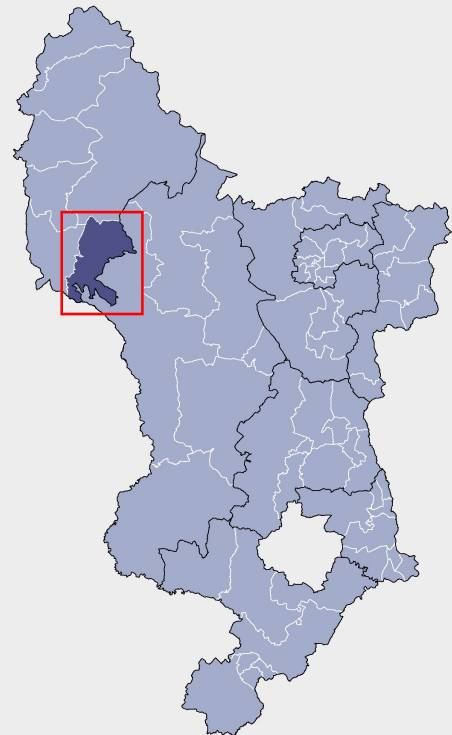
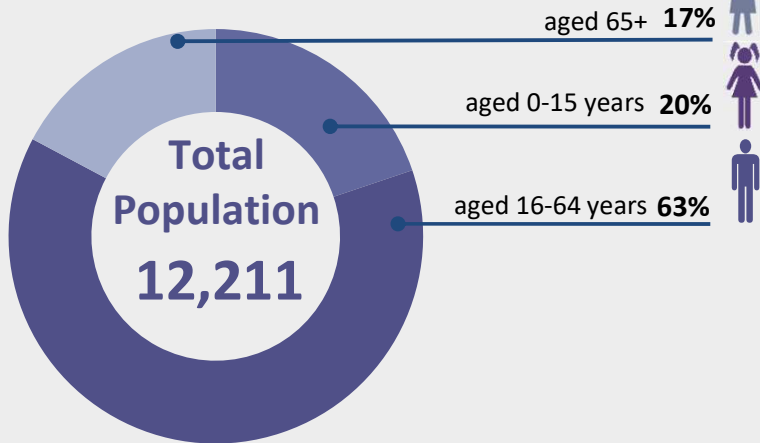


2023 Area Summary Profile Buxton North and East Electoral Division

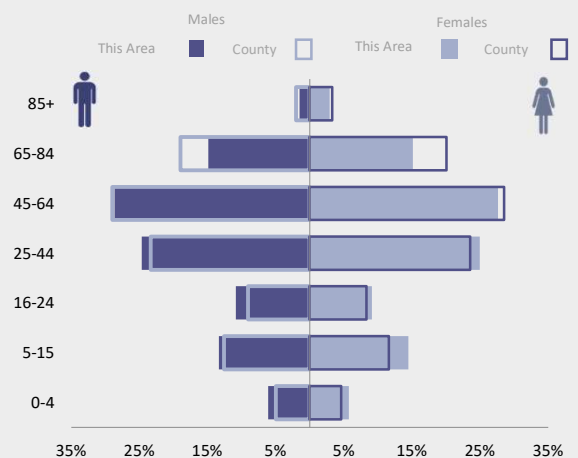

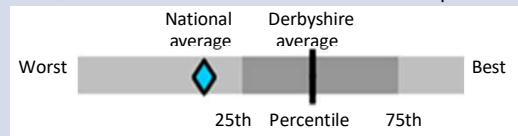
