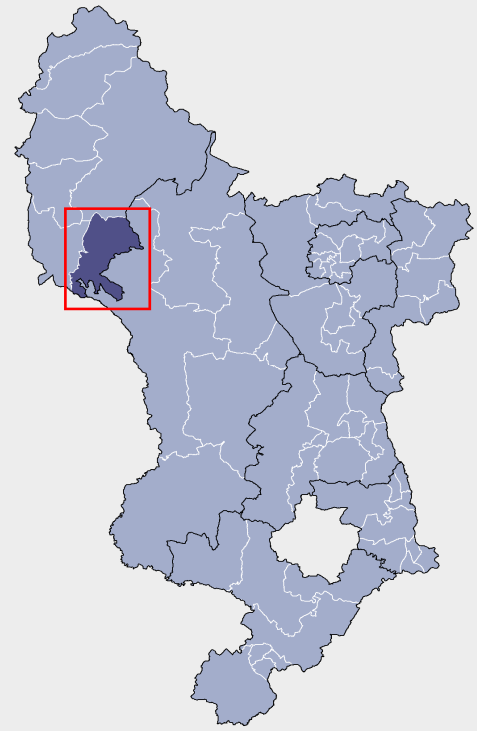
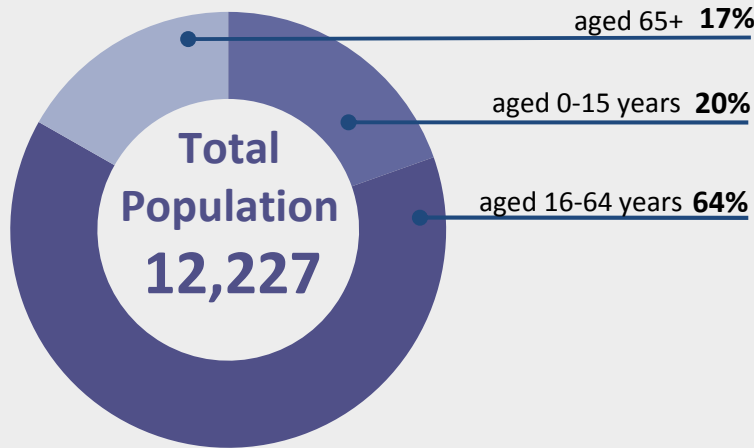

## Buxton North and East Electoral Division

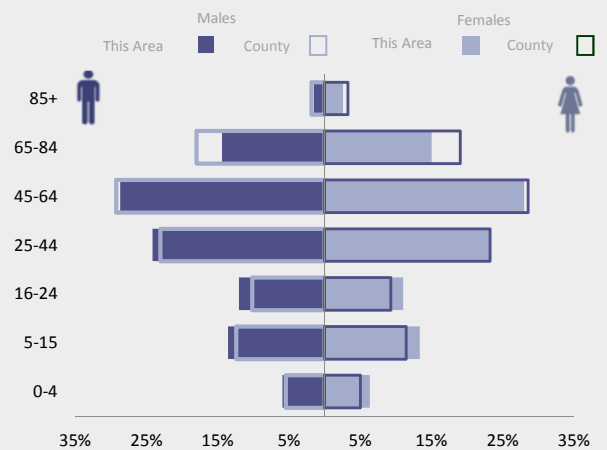

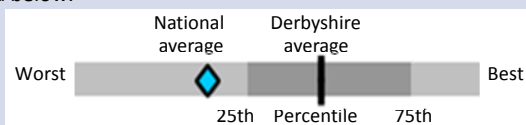
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Buxton North and East Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
