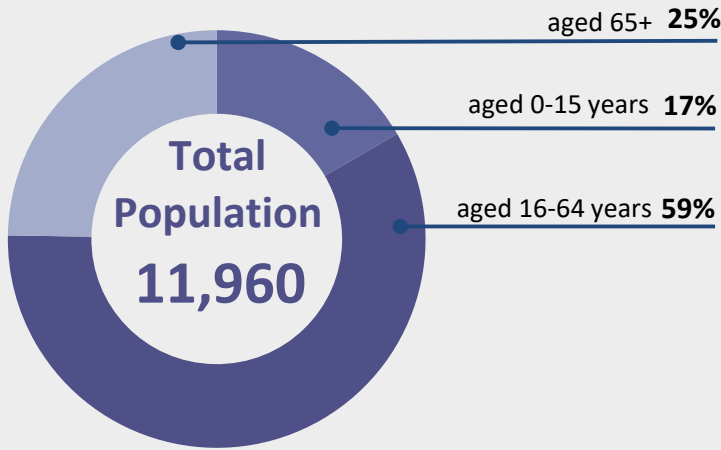
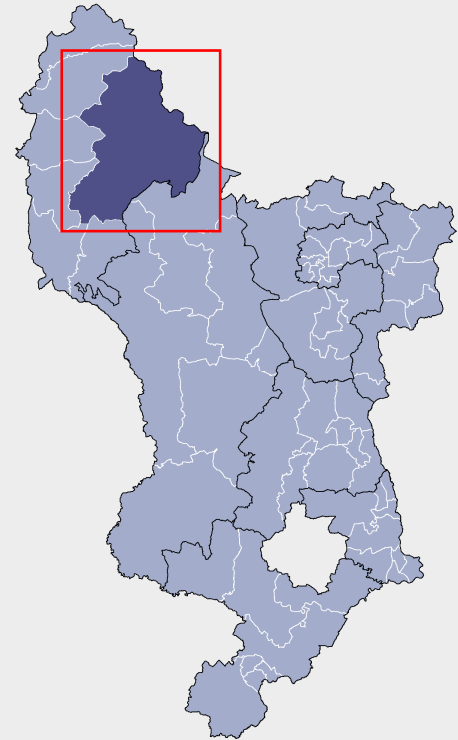


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Chapel and Hope Valley Electoral Division

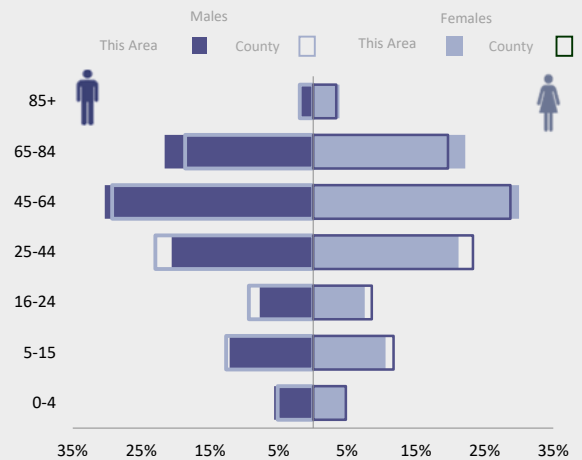

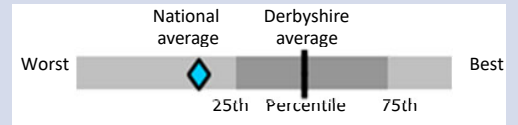

# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Chapel and Hope Valley Electoral Division

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
