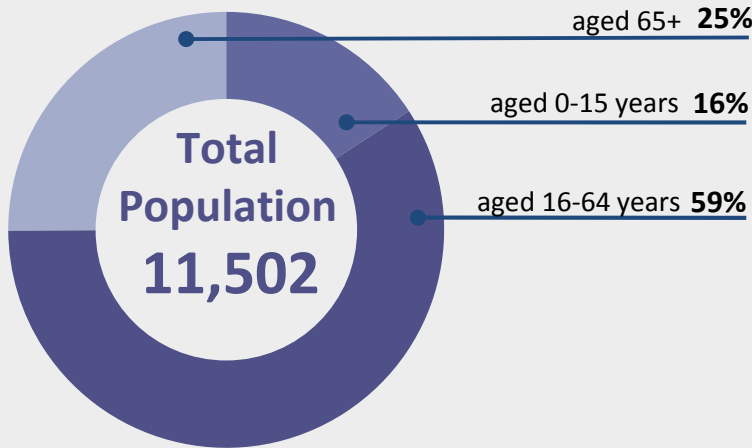
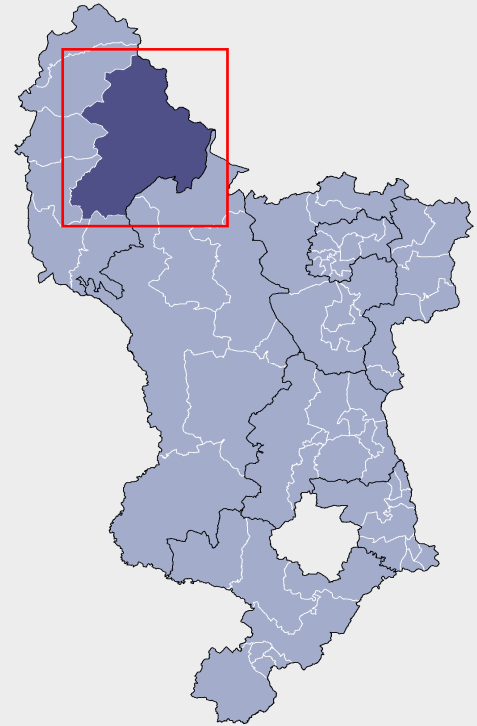


2018 Area Summary Profile Chapel and Hope Valley Electoral Division

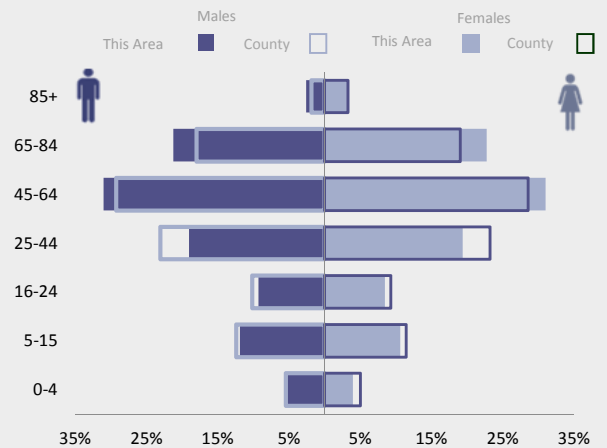

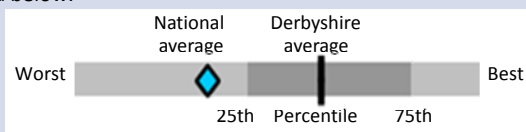

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
