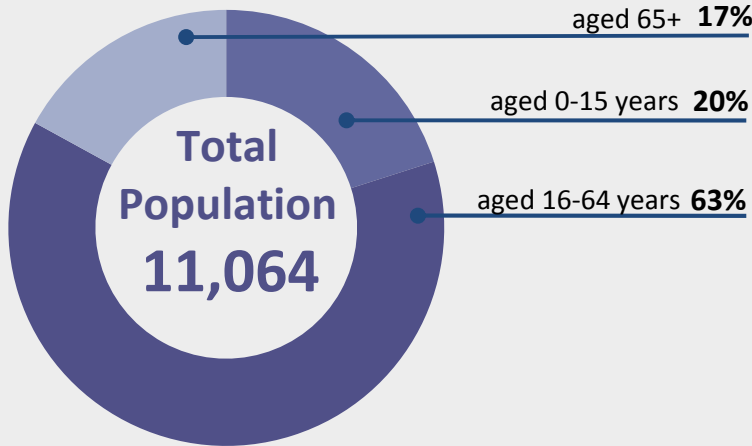
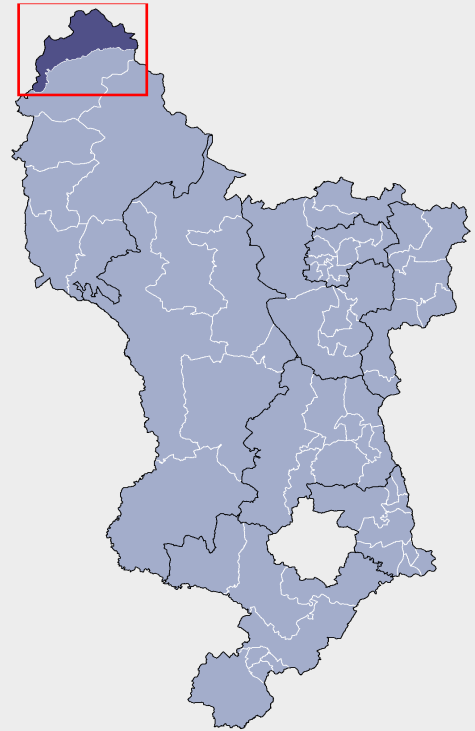


2018 Area Summary Profile Etherow Electoral Division

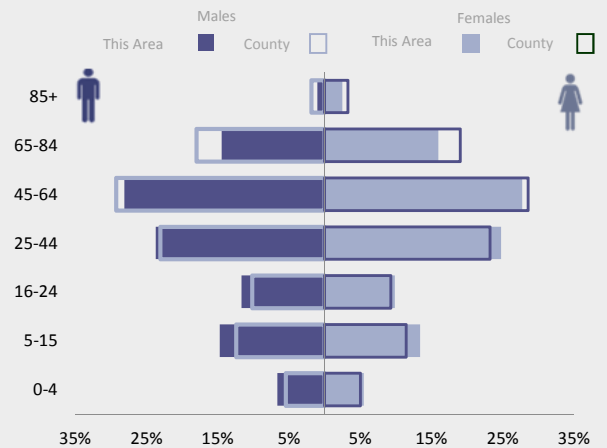

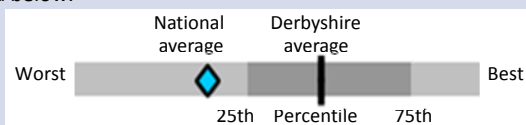
