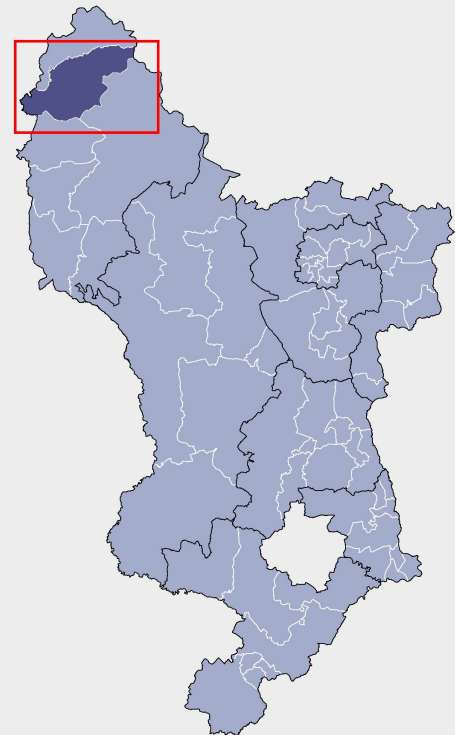
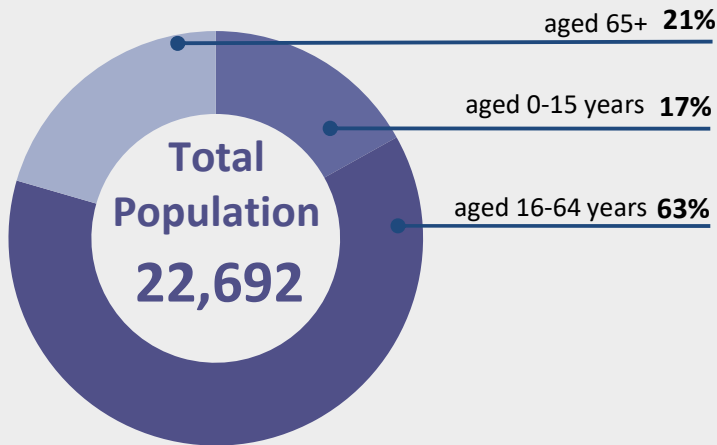


2023 Area Summary Profile Glossop and Charlesworth Electoral Division

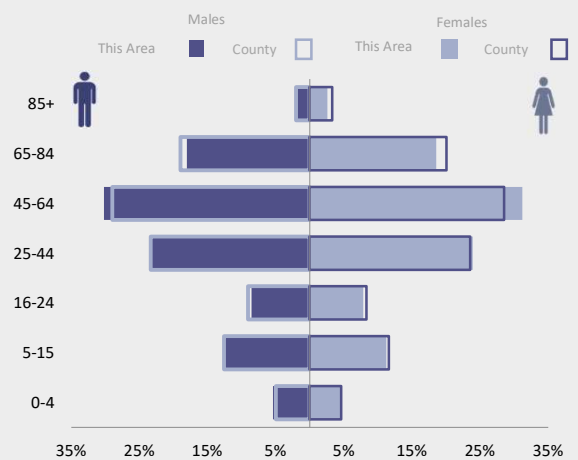

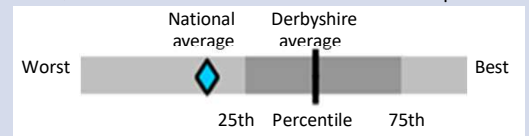
