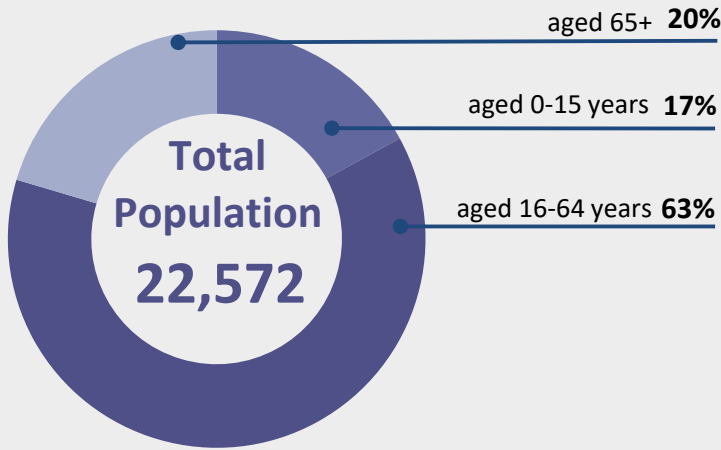
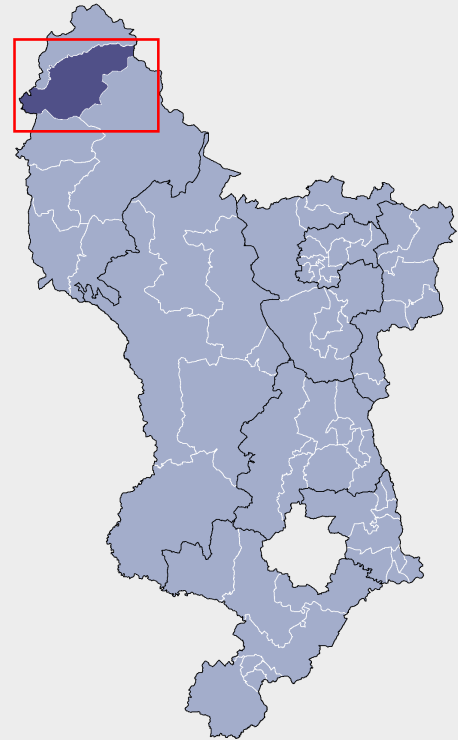


# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Glossop and Charlesworth Electoral Division

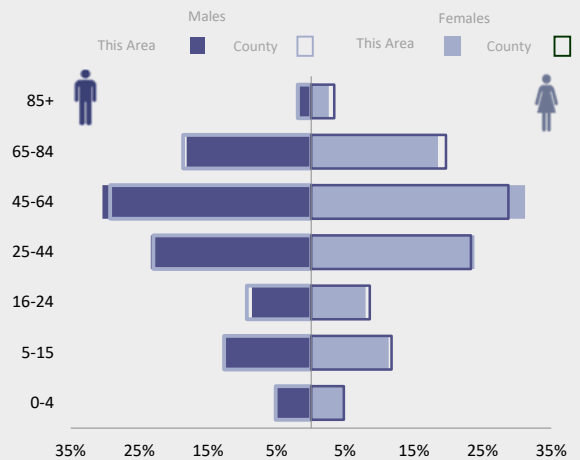

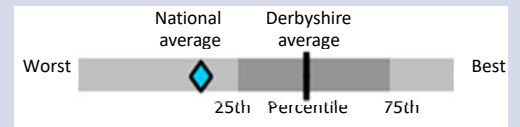

## Glossop and Charlesworth Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
