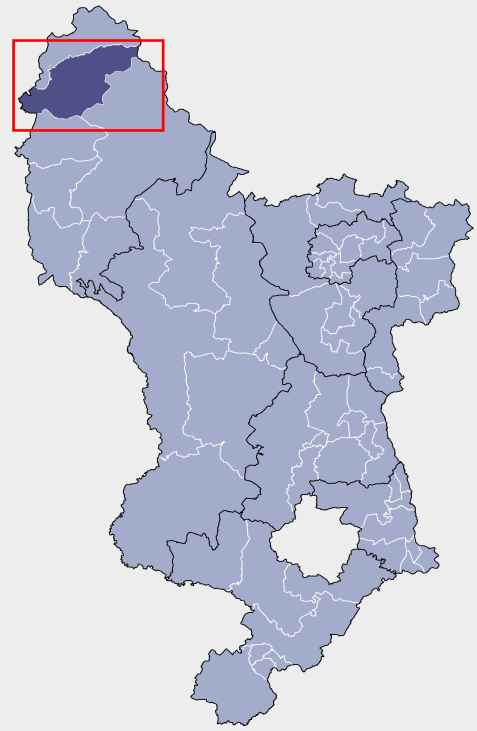
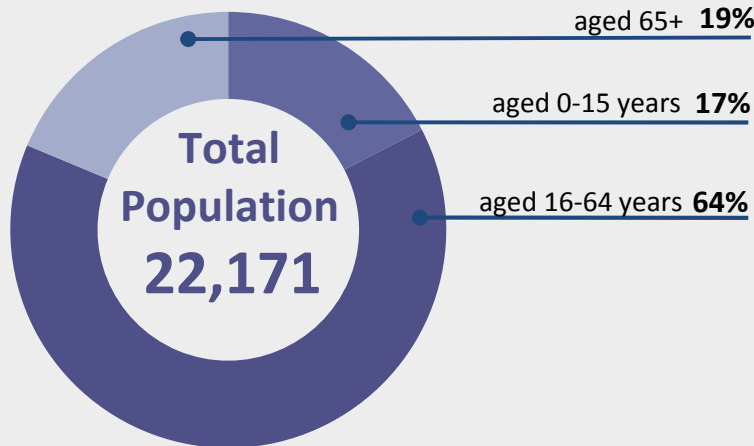


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Glossop and Charlesworth Electoral Division

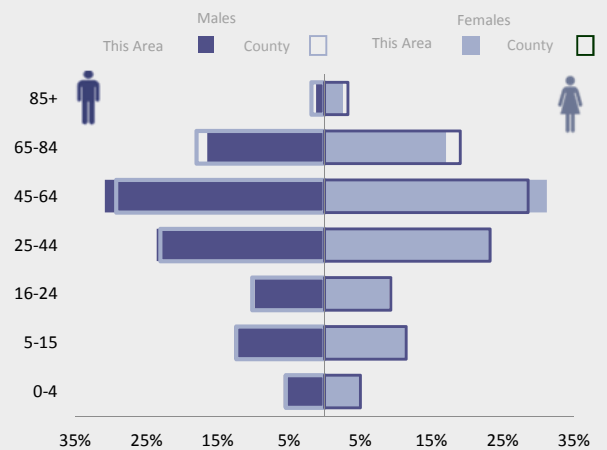

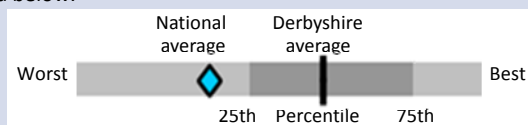
# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Glossop and Charlesworth Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire. The local result for each indicator is shown as a circle against the range of results for the chosen local geography within Derbyshire's administrative boundary.
