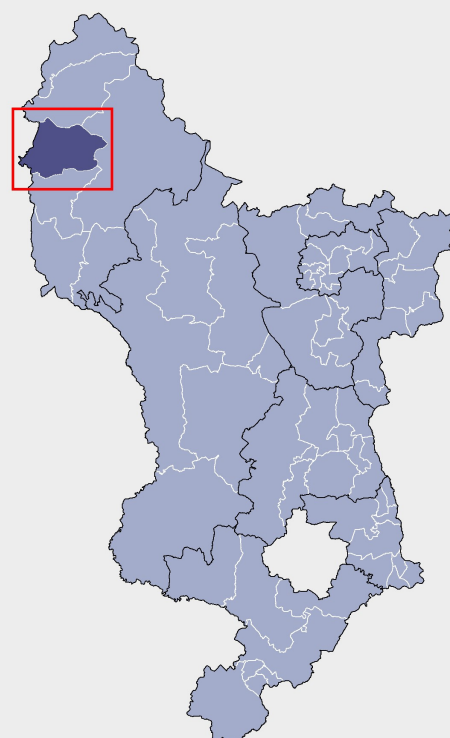
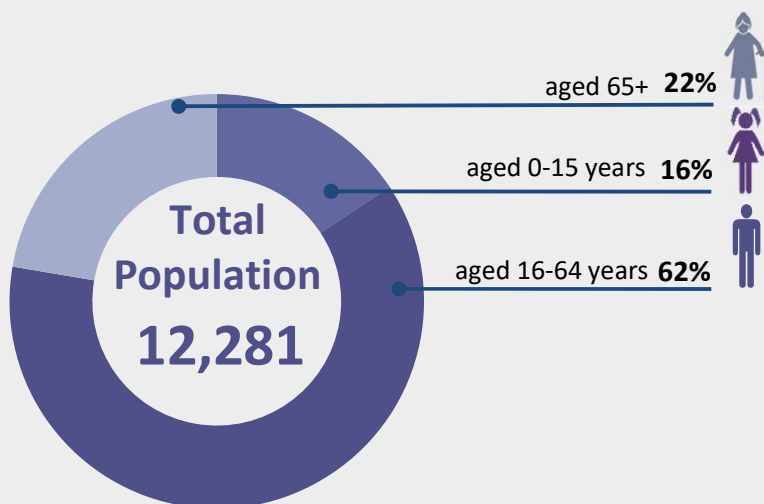


2023 Area Summary Profile New Mills Electoral Division

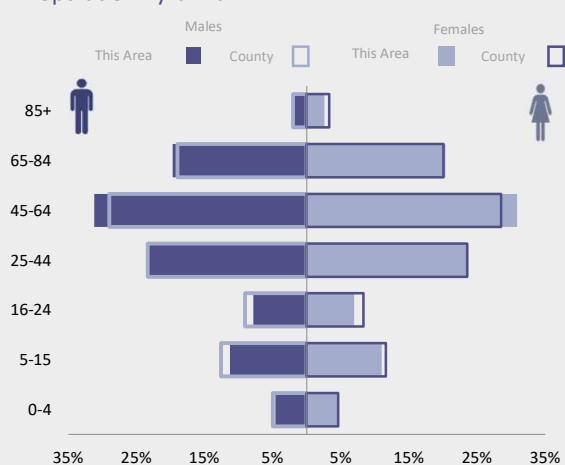

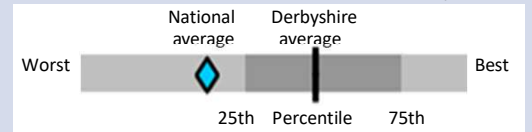
