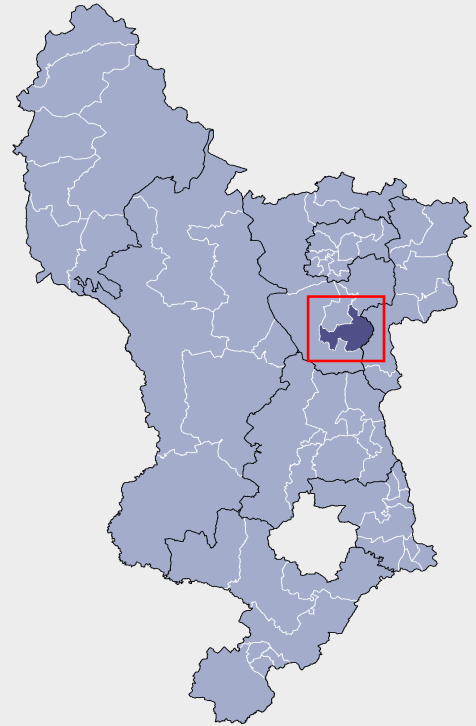
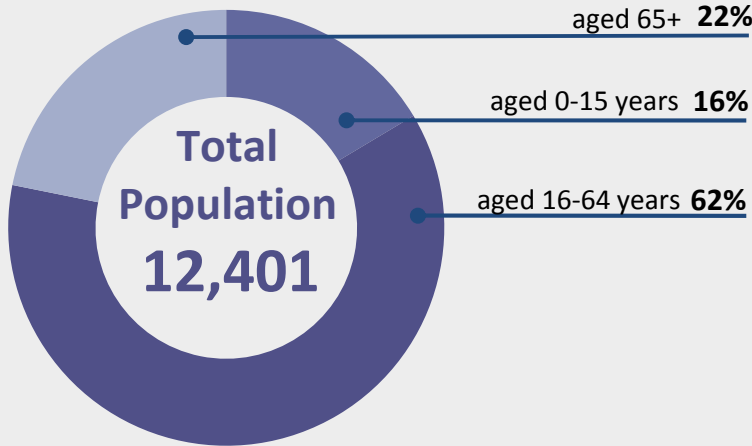


2018 Area Summary Profile Clay Cross South Electoral Division

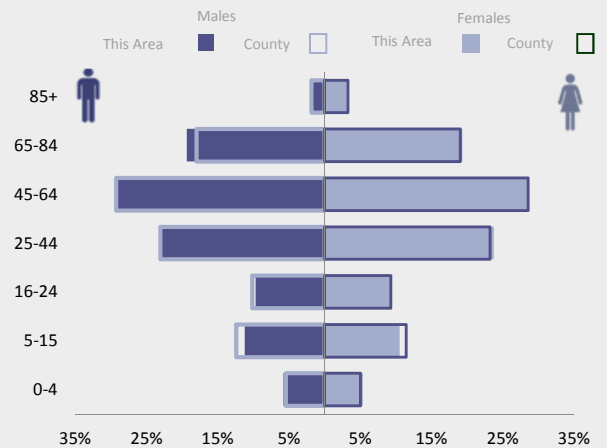

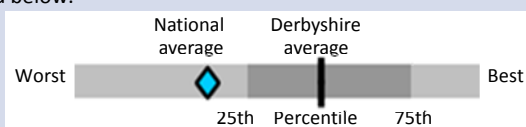
