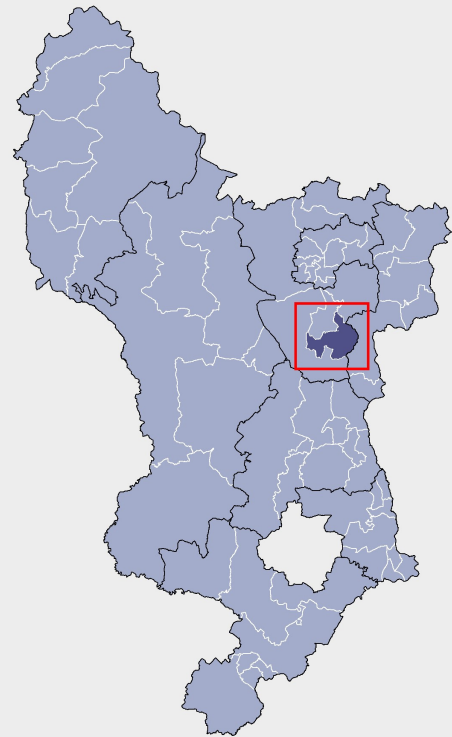
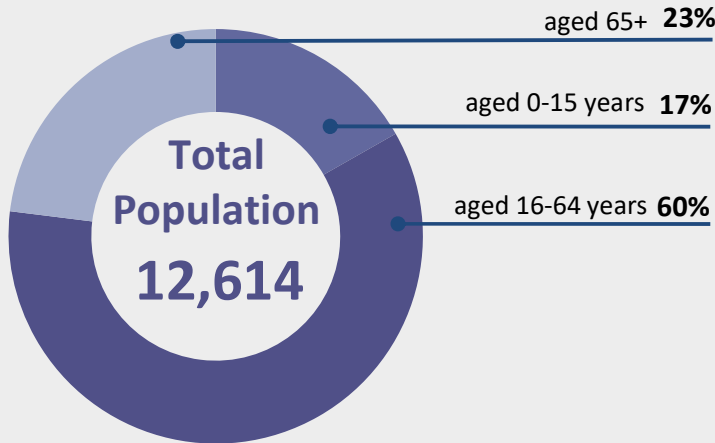


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Clay Cross South Electoral Division

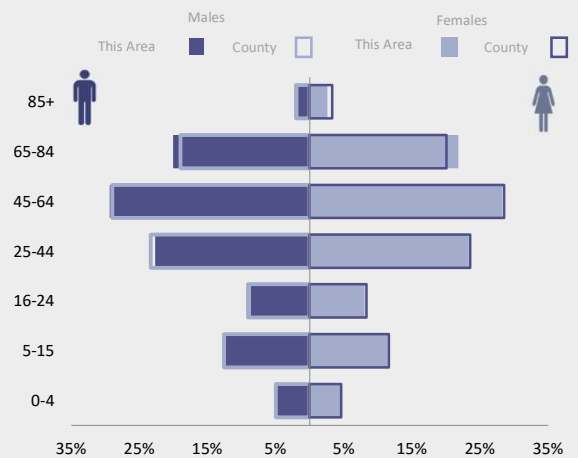

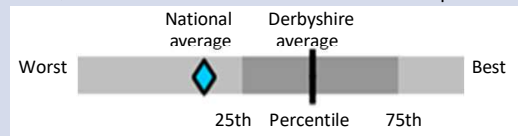
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Clay Cross South Electoral Division
