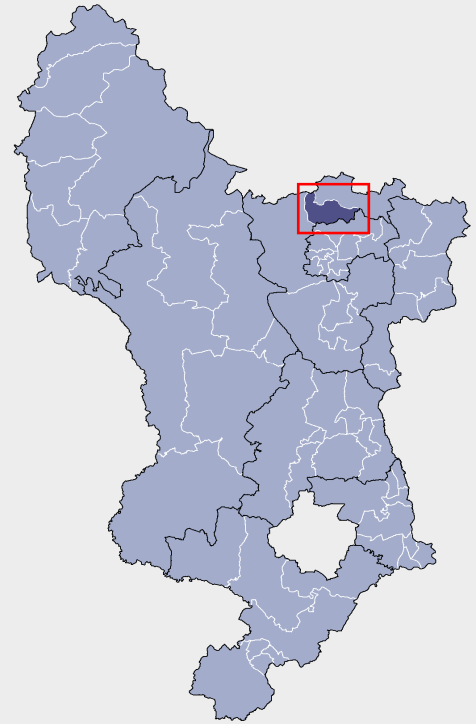
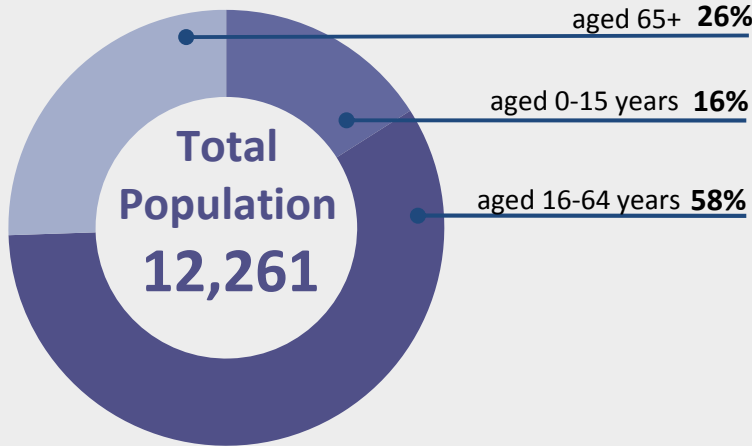


2018 Area Summary Profile Dronfield East Electoral Division



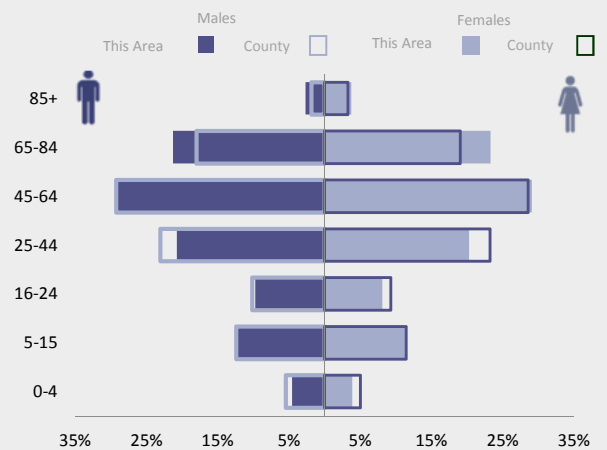

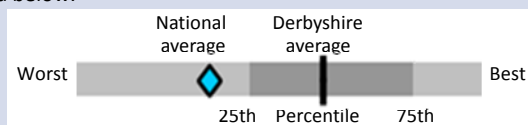
