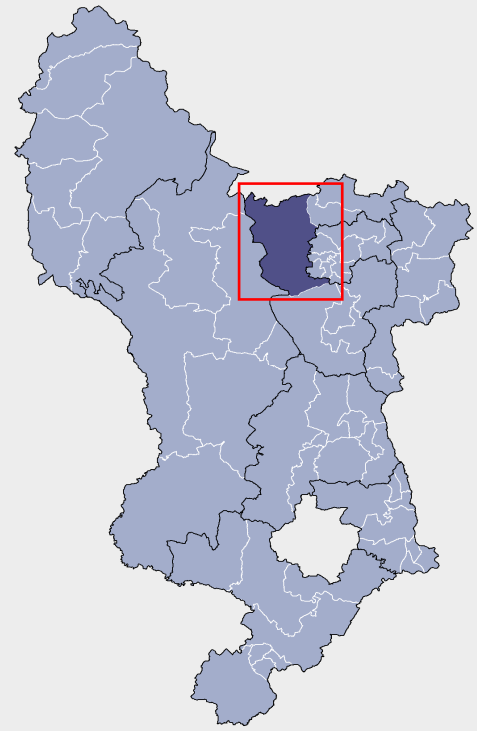
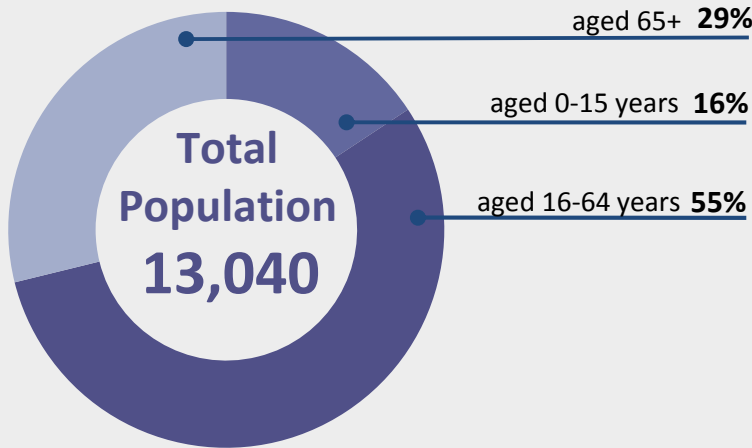

Dronfield West and Walton Electoral Division

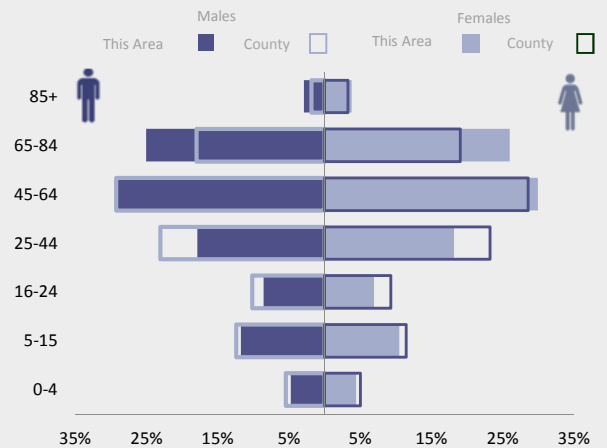

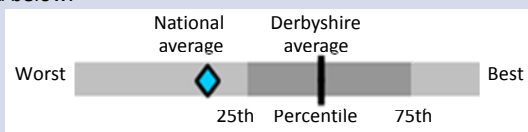
