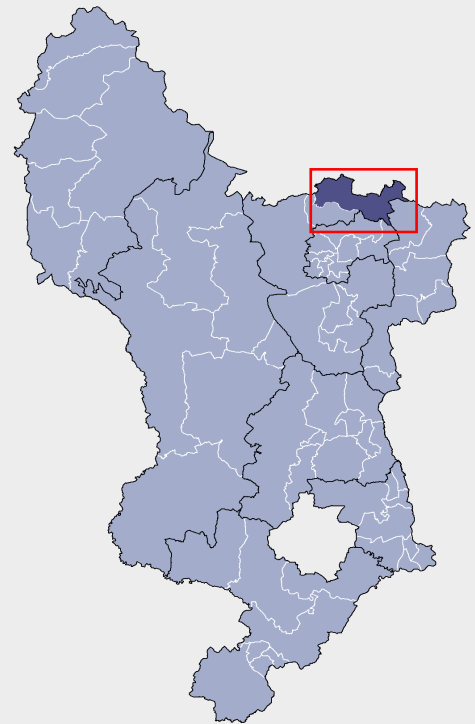
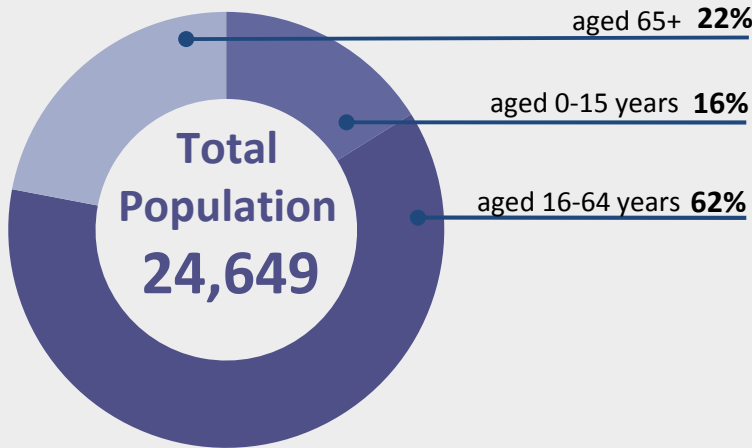

## Eckington and Killamarsh Electoral Division

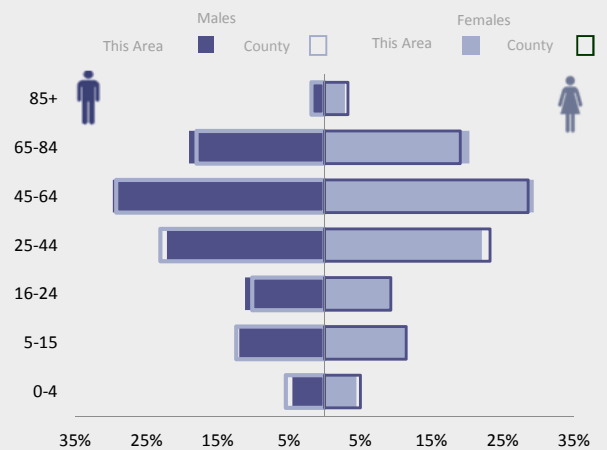

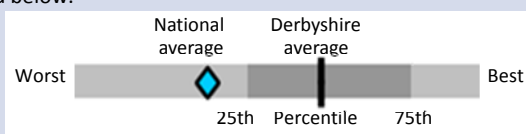
# 2018 Area Summary Profile
