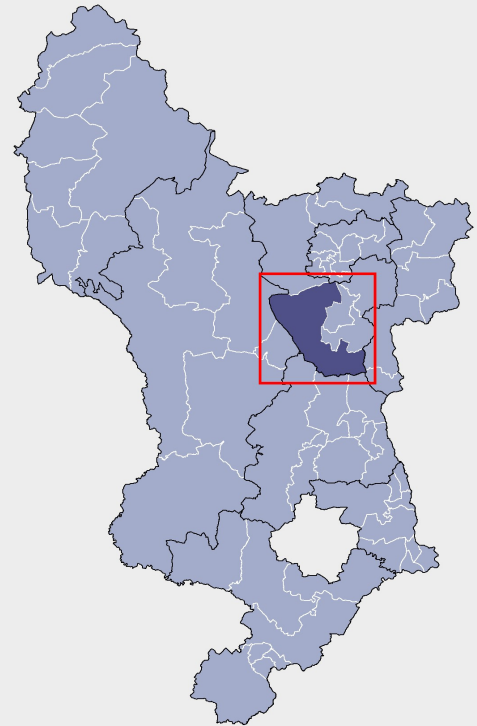
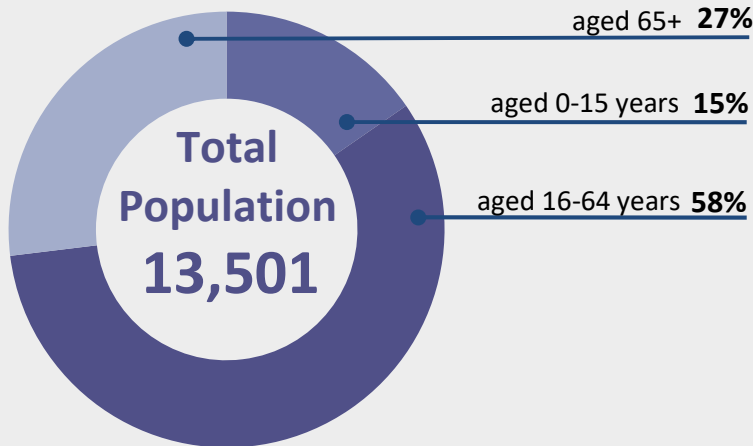

## Wingerworth and Shirland Electoral Division

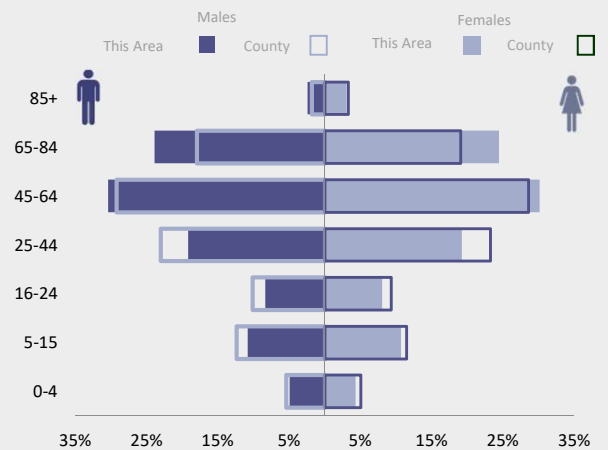

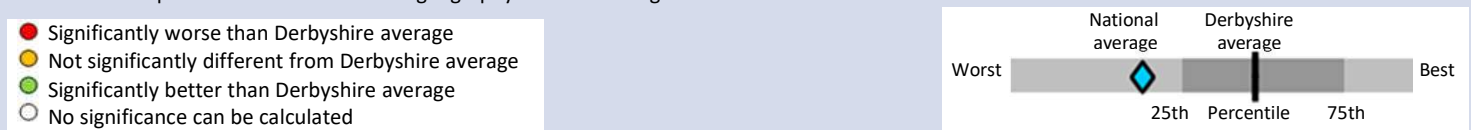

## Wingerworth and Shirland Electoral Division
