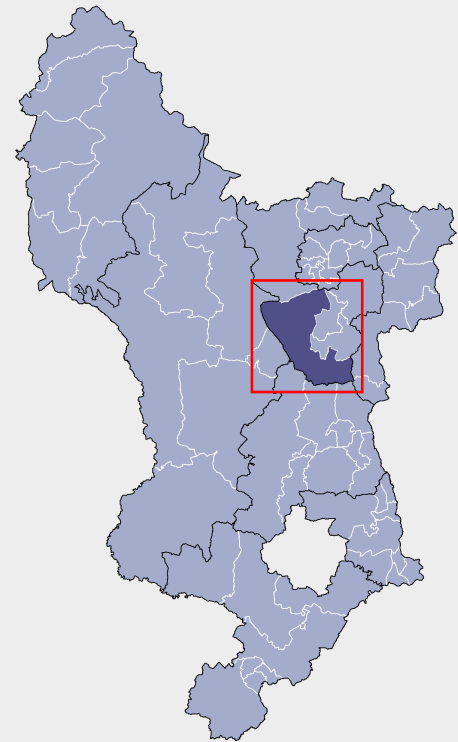
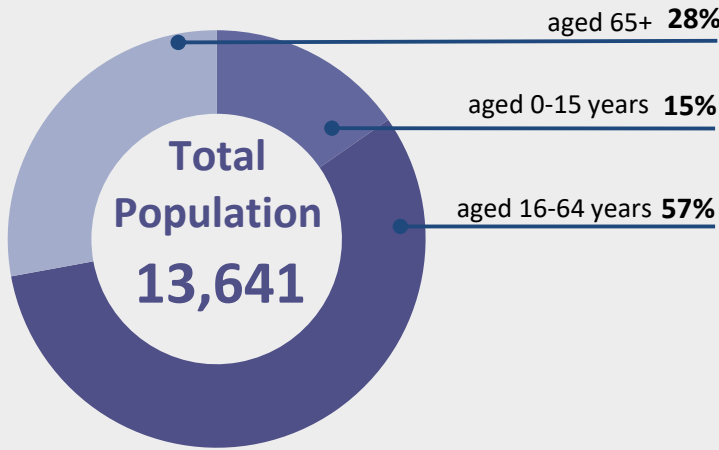

Wingerworth and Shirland Electoral Division

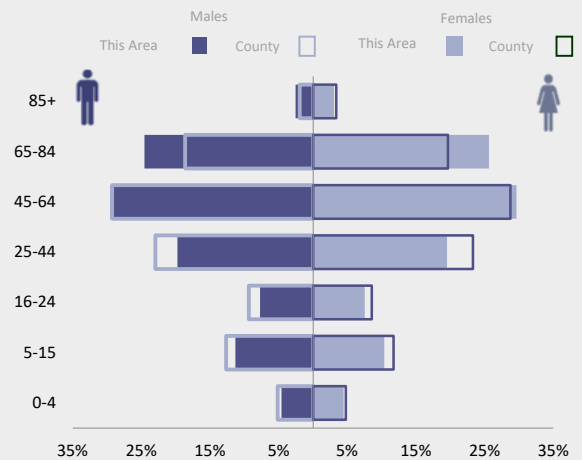

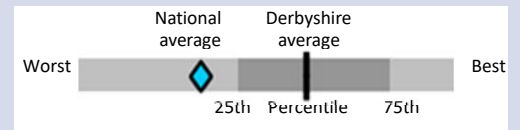

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
