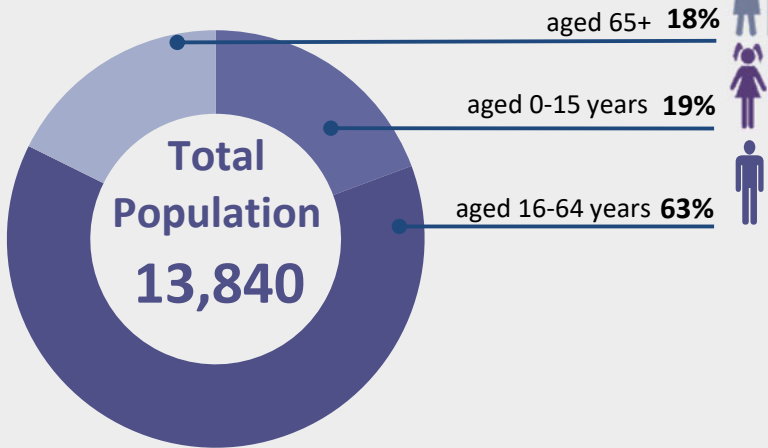
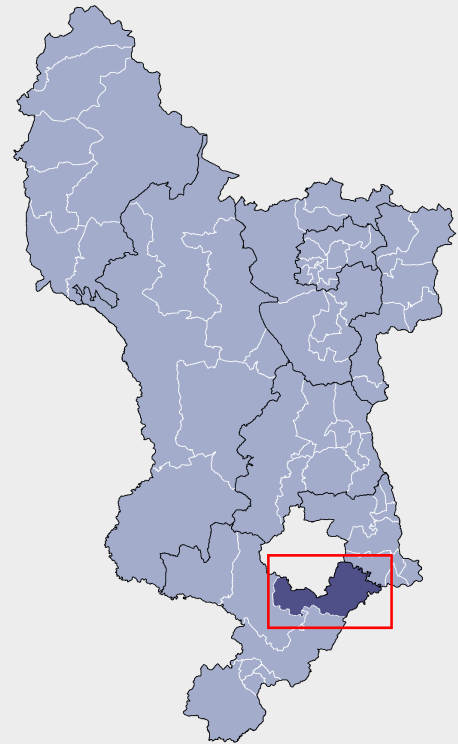


2021 Area Summary Profile Aston Electoral Division

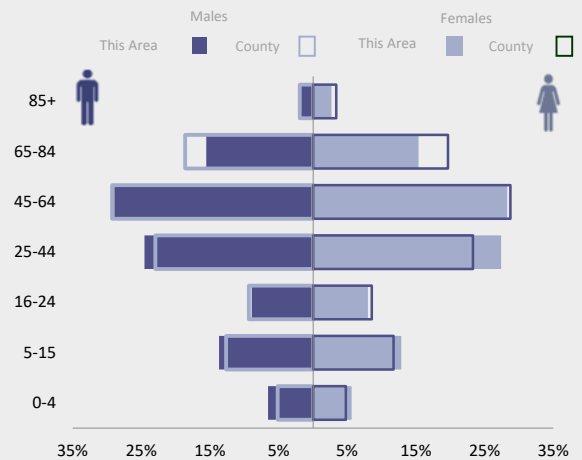

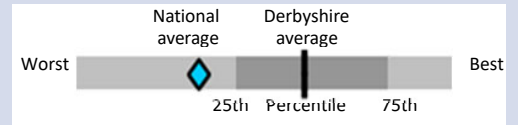
