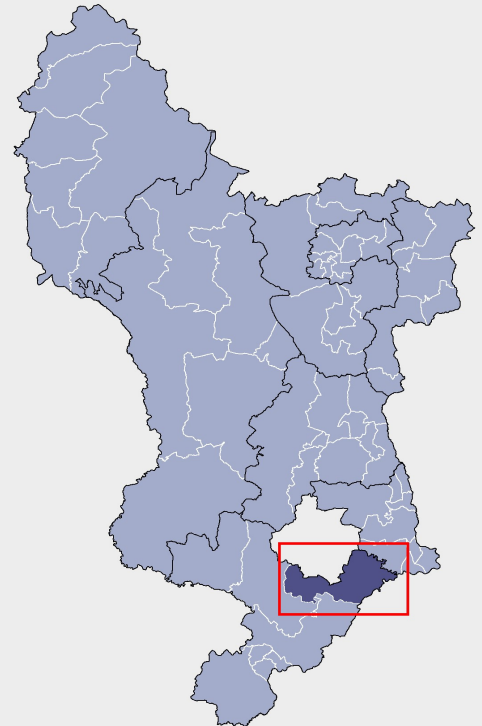
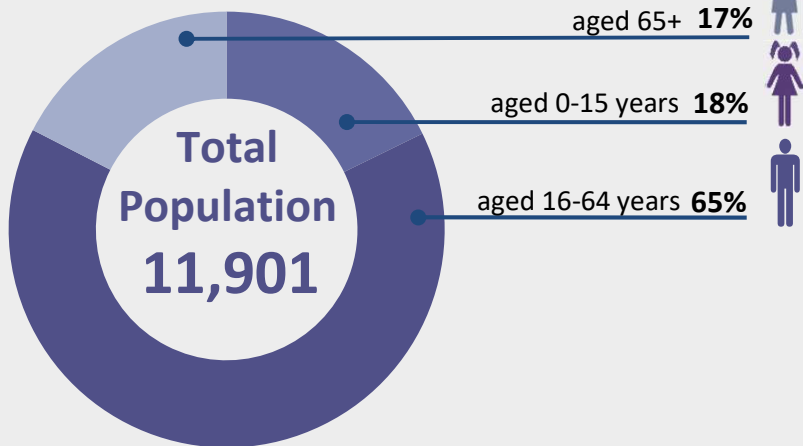


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Aston Electoral Division

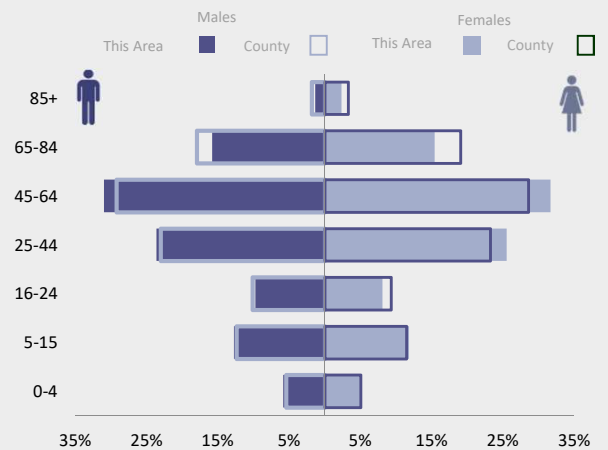

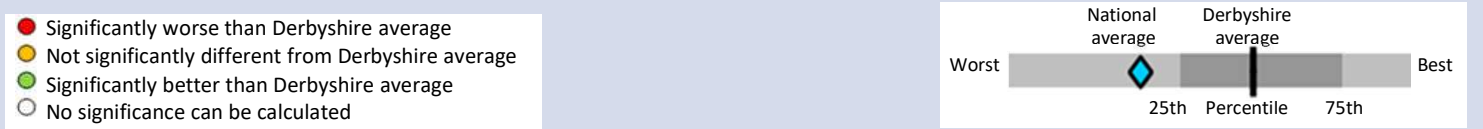

## Aston Electoral Division



The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
