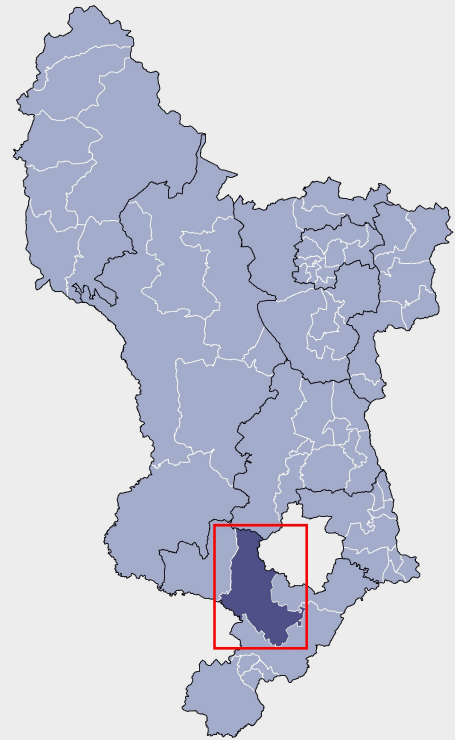
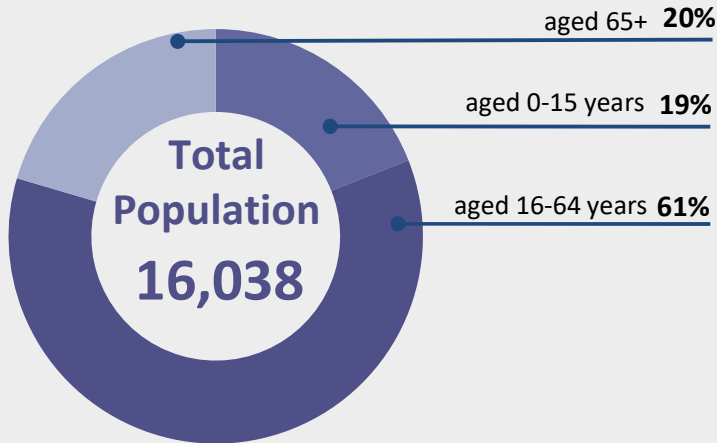


2023 Area Summary Profile Etwall and Repton Electoral Division

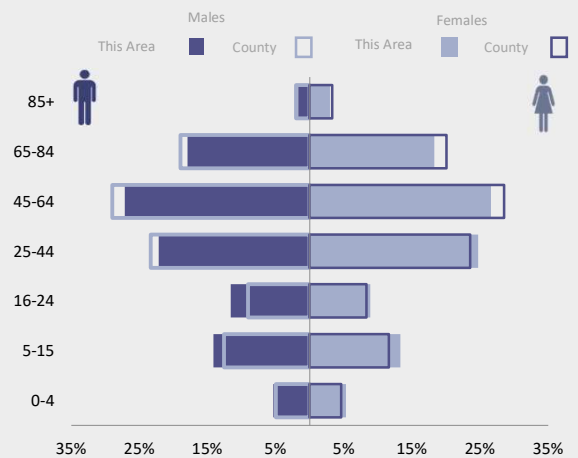

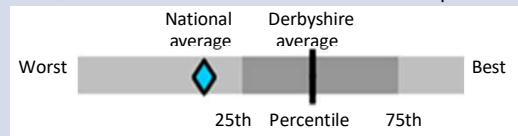

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
