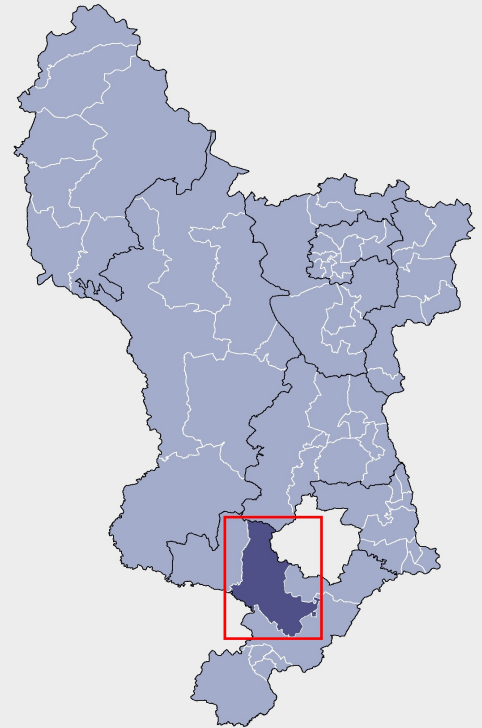
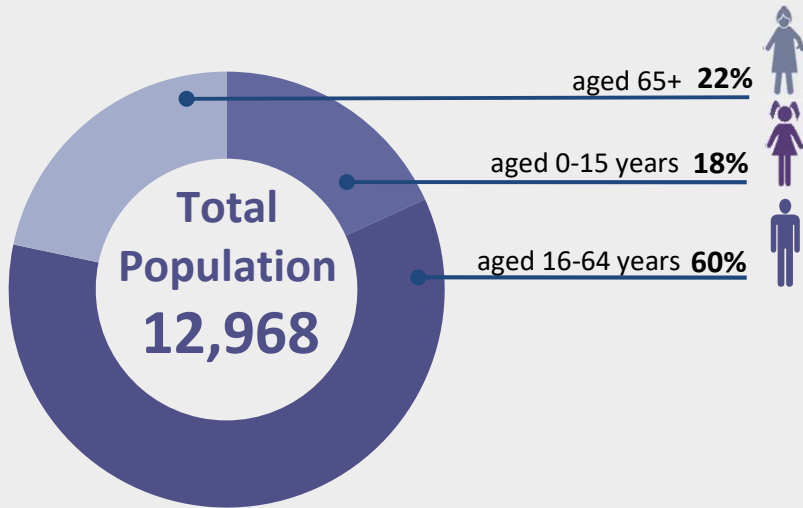


# 2018 Area Summary Profile Etwall and Repton Electoral Division

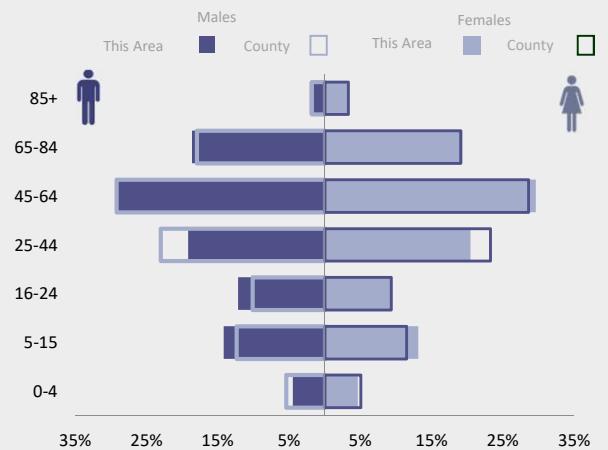

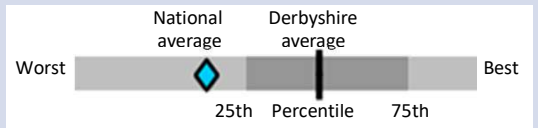

# 2018 Area Summary Profile

## Etwell and Repton Electoral Division

The chart below compares a range of indicators for Derbyshire.
