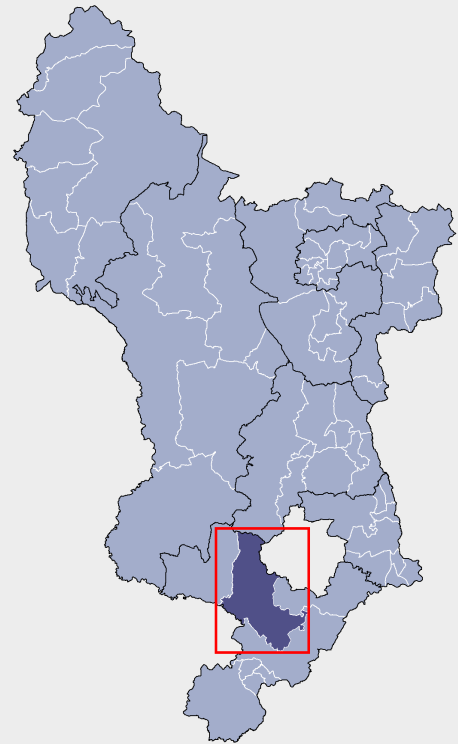
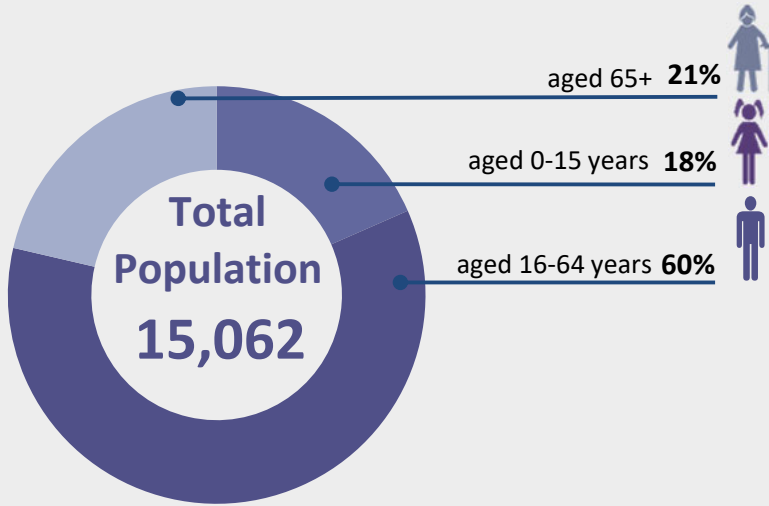


2021 Area Summary Profile Etwall and Repton Electoral Division

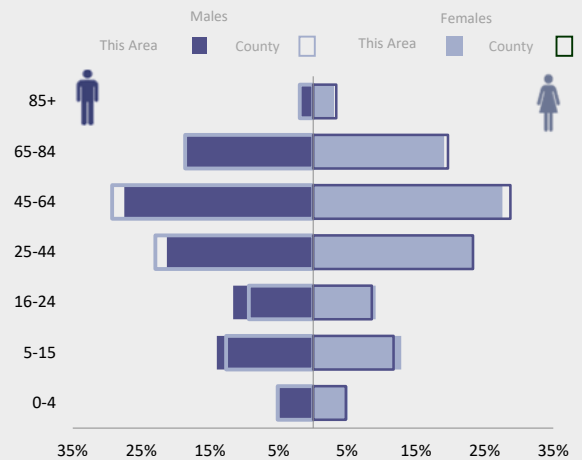

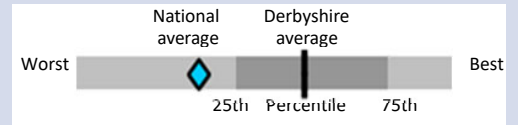
