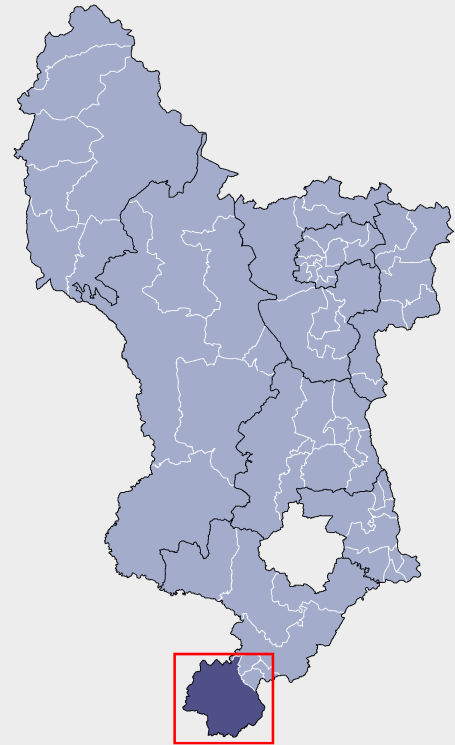
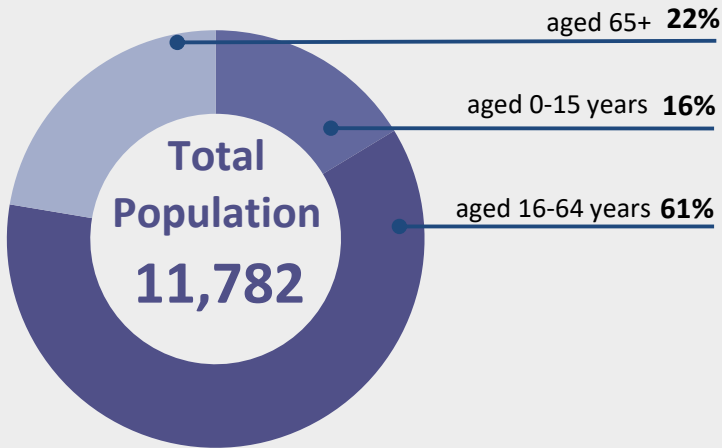


2021 Area Summary Profile Linton Electoral Division

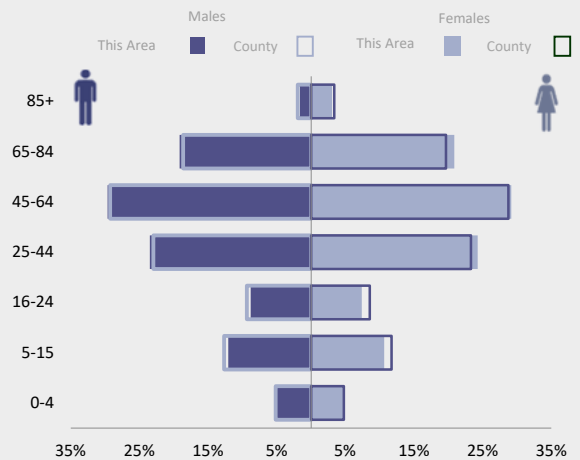

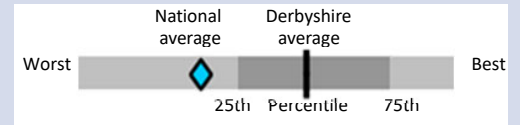
