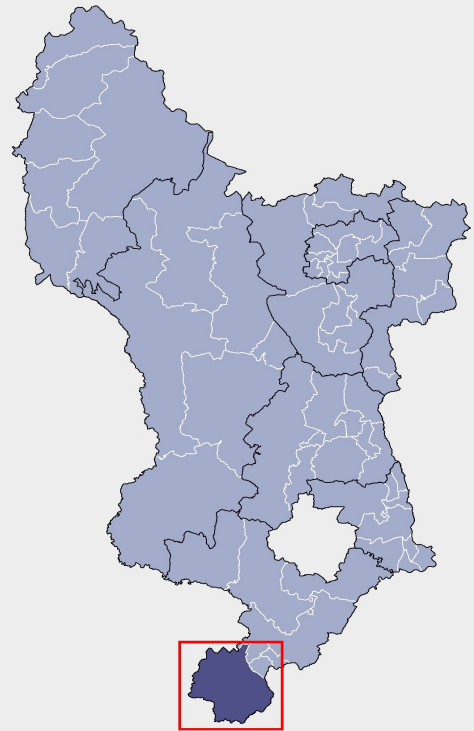
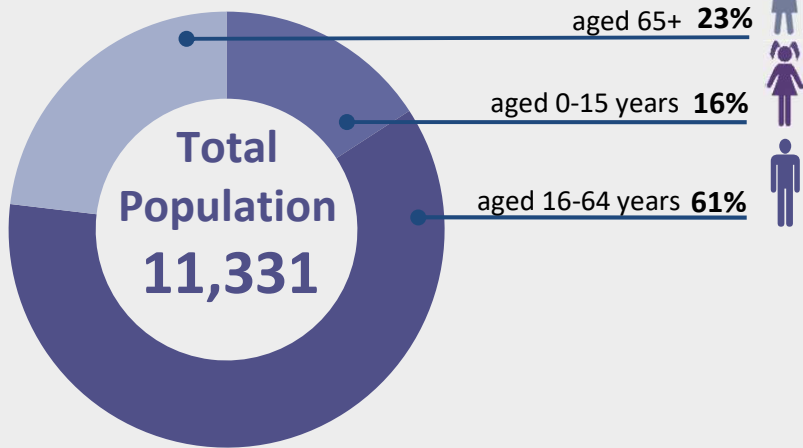


2018 Area Summary Profile Linton Electoral Division

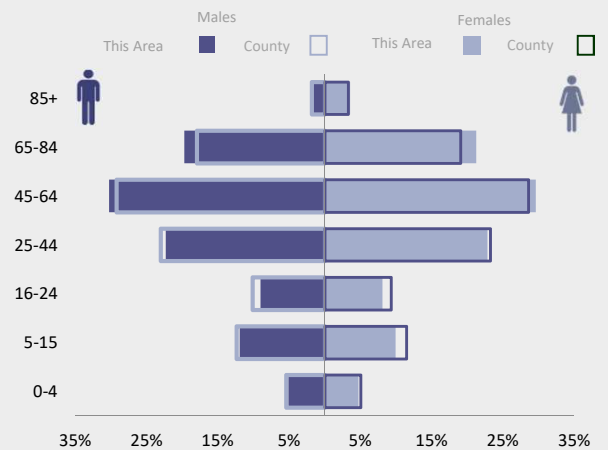

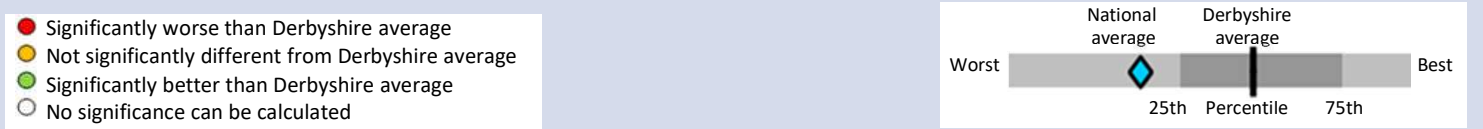
