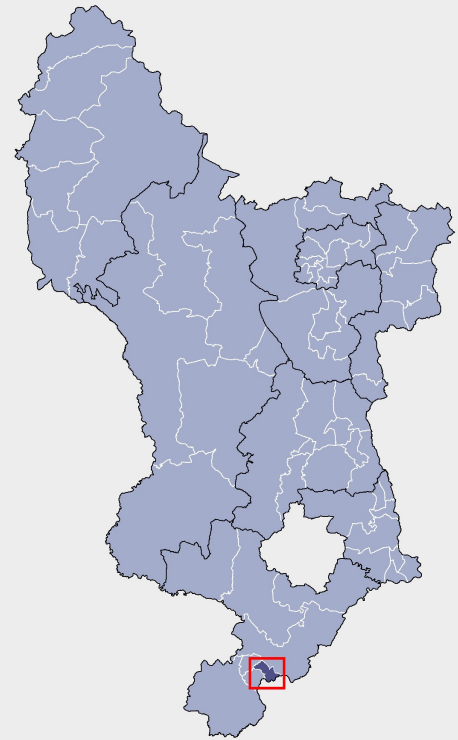
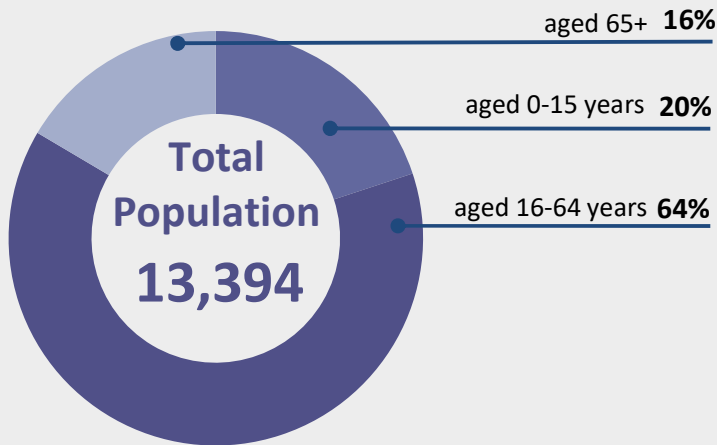


# 2023 Area Summary Profile Swadlincote Central Electoral Division

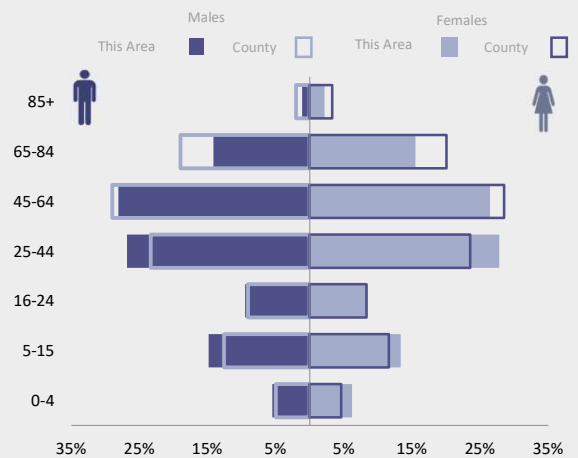


Swadlincote Central in the south of South Derbyshire includes parts of Swadlincote, Midway and Woodville wards and is mainly urban in nature.

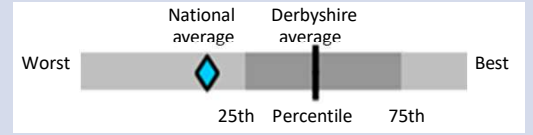
# 2023 Area Summary Profile

## Swadlincote Central Electoral Division
