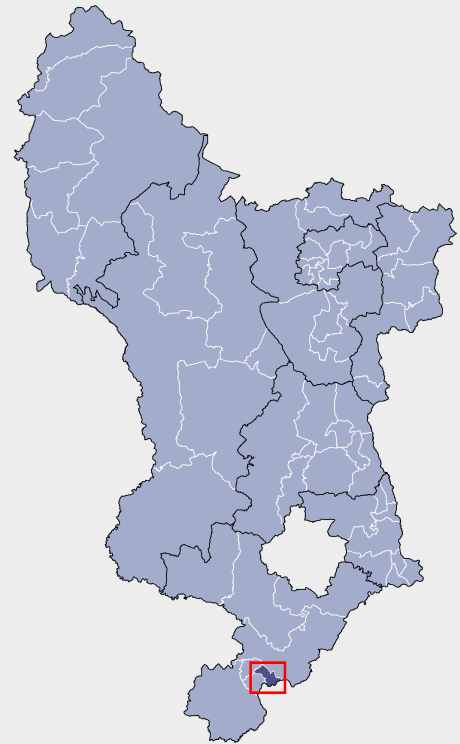
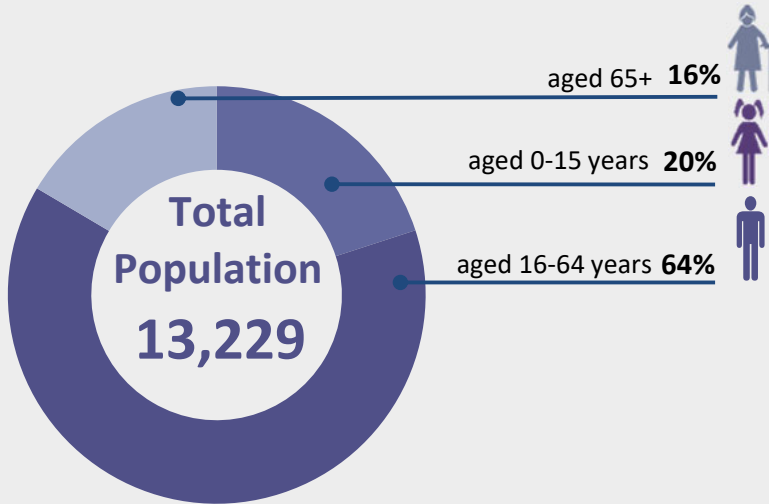

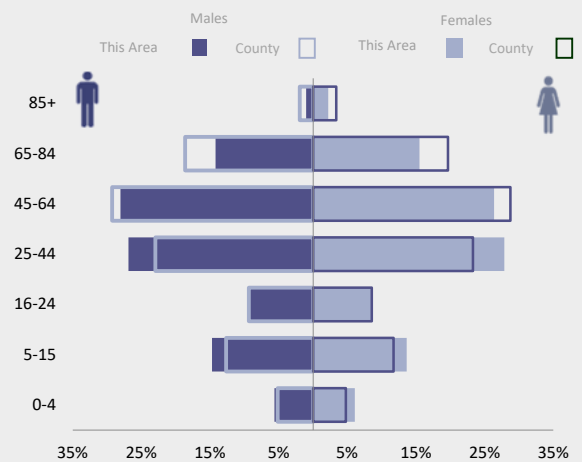


Swadlincote Central in the south of South Derbyshire includes parts of Swadlincote, Midway and Woodville wards and is mainly urban in nature.

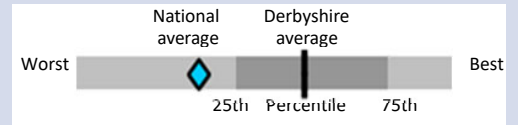
