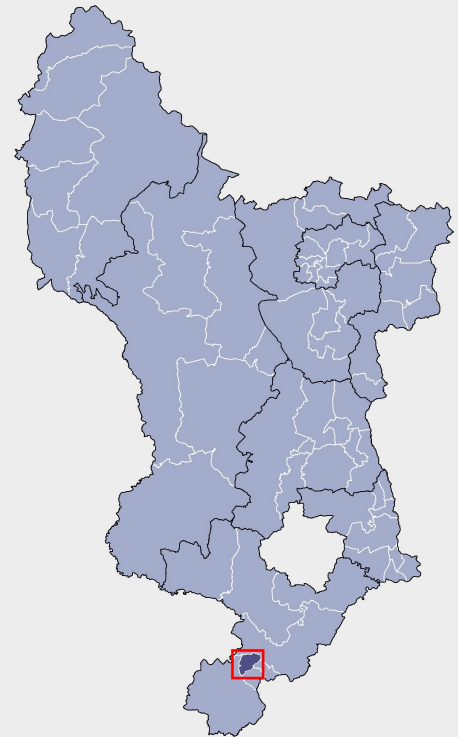
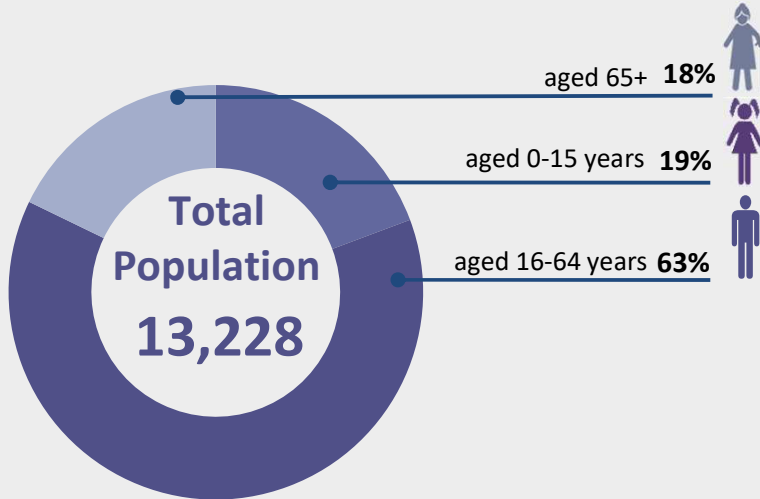


2023 Area Summary Profile Swadlincote North Electoral Division

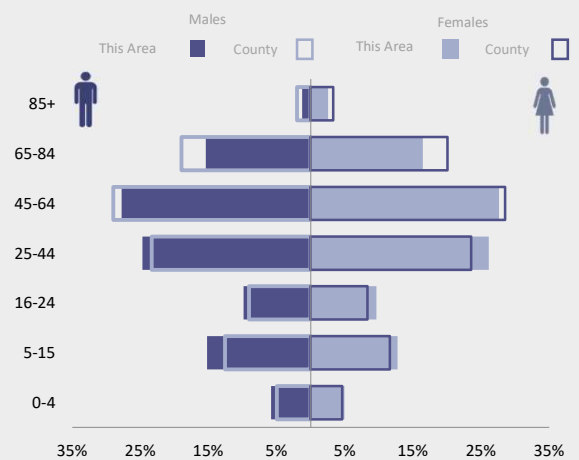

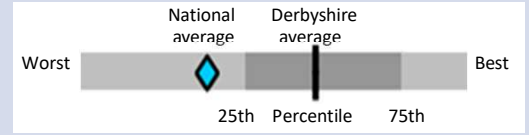
