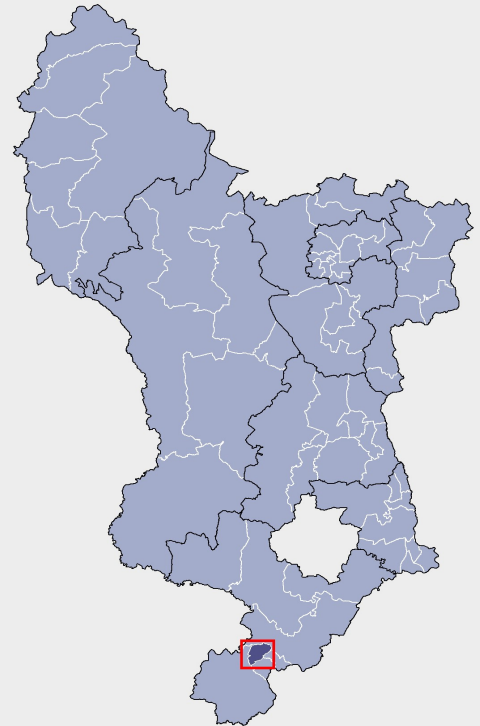
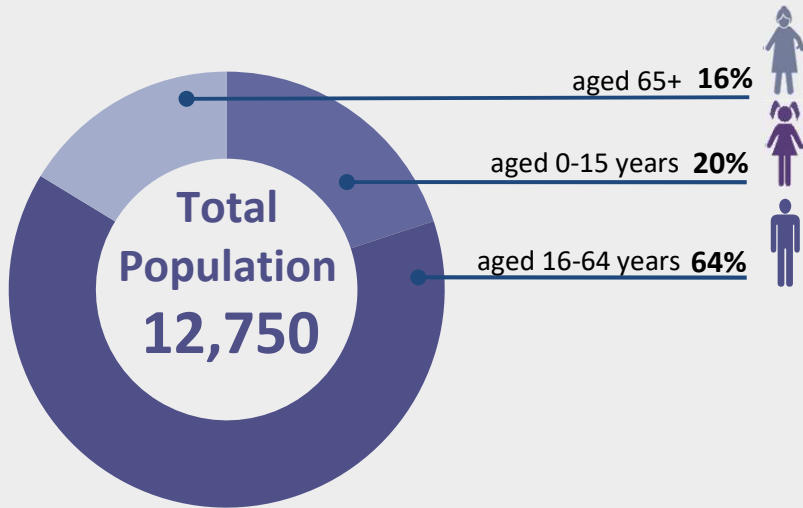


2018 Area Summary Profile Swadlincote North Electoral Division

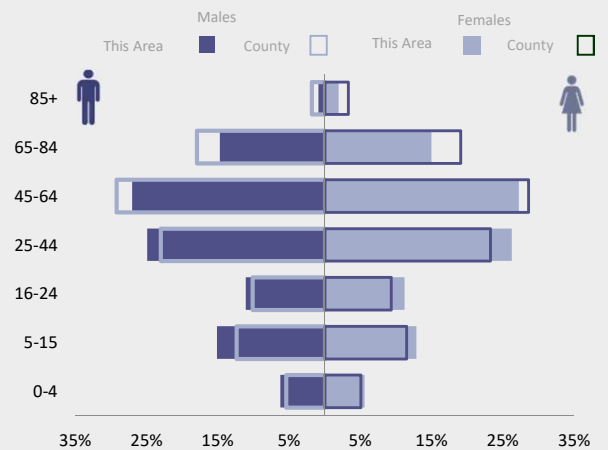

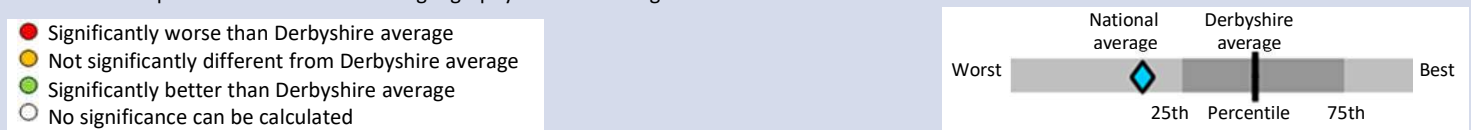
