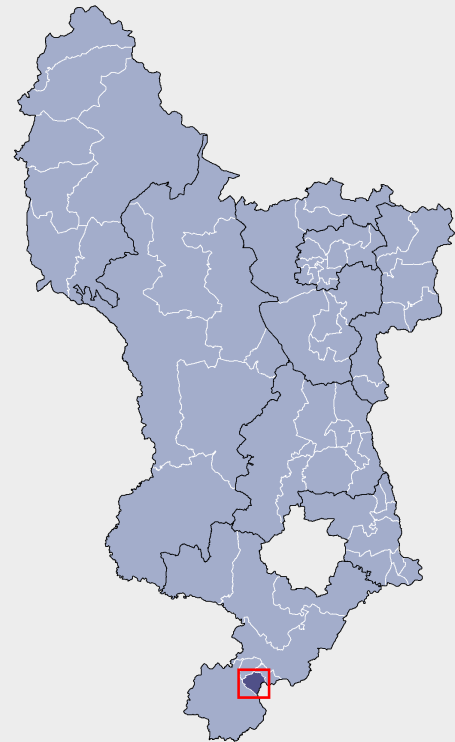
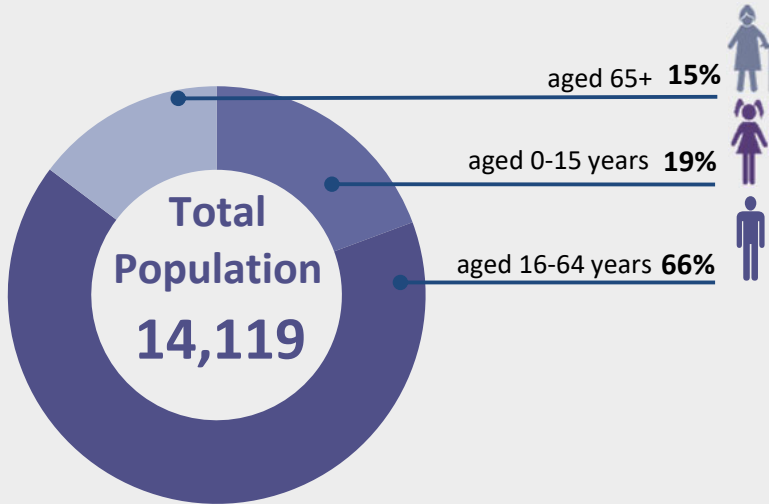


# 2021 Area Summary Profile Swadlincote South Electoral Division

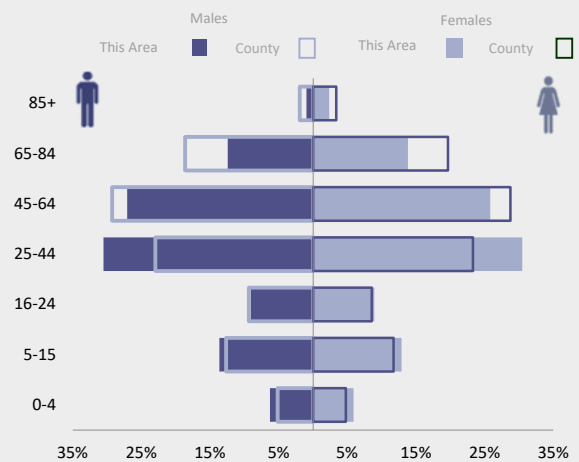


Swadlincote South Division comprises the ward of Church Gresley and part of the Swadlincote. The division is urban in nature and located in the south of South Derbyshire district.

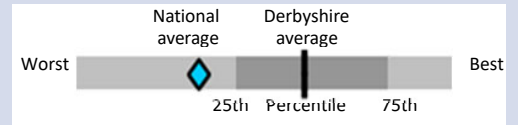
# 2021 Area Summary Profile

## Swadlincote South Electoral Division
