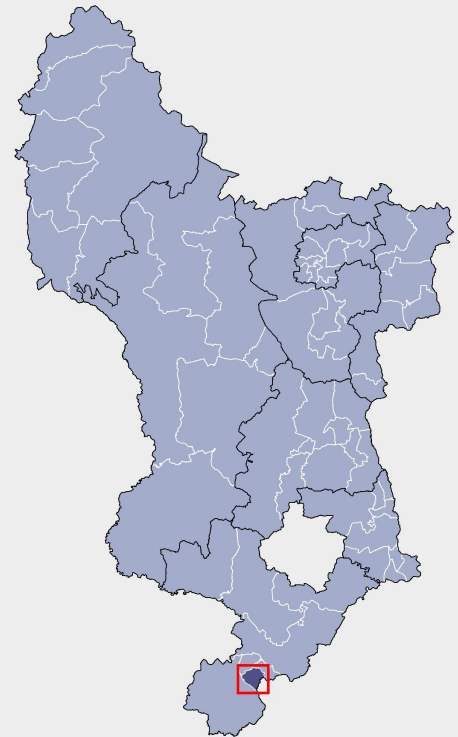
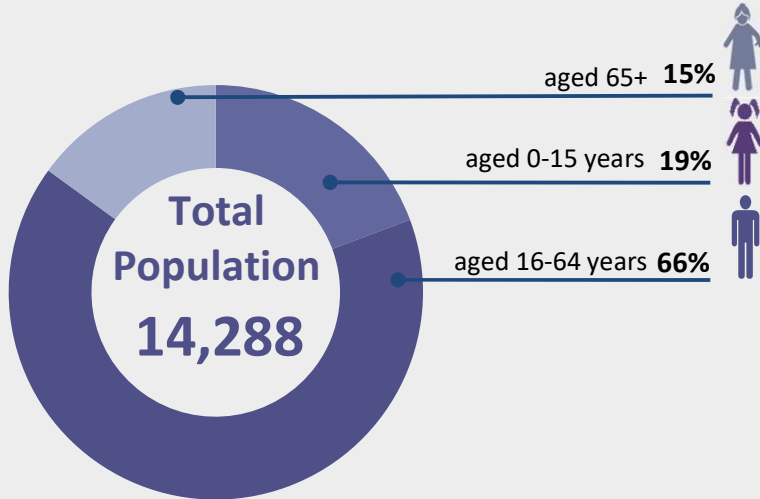

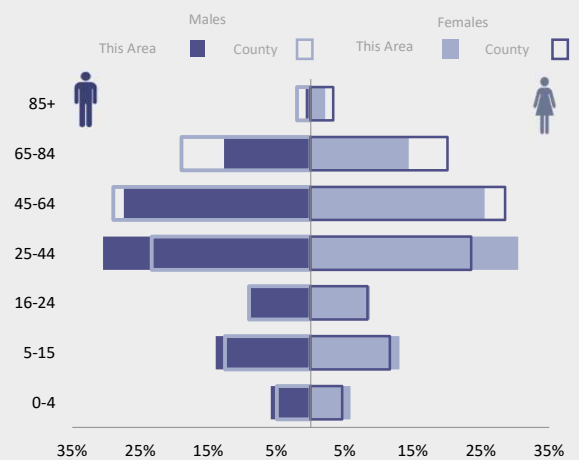


Swadlincote South Division comprises the ward of Church Gresley and part of the Swadlincote. The division is urban in nature and located in the south of South Derbyshire district.

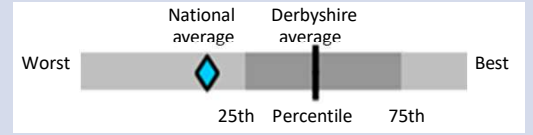
